Dear Griswold High School Parents and Guardians,

I hope you have had a wonderful week. It was so nice having a full week of school! We are all preparing for the end of the first semester of the school year, which includes midterm exams. I have A LOT of information to share this week, so please read through carefully. I appreciate it!

Mid-Year Exams: These are high stake assessments evaluating progress towards skills and standards in each course. Exams will take place from Tuesday, 01/21 through Friday, 01/24. These are shortened days for students with dismissal at noon. Please see below for details on our GHS exam schedule. Please reach out if you have any questions or concerns, and *encourage your children to prepare!*

PSAT scores from October are out! Please be sure to review your child's score on the College Board. There are resources to inform setting progress goals for your child in preparation for the SAT and beyond. In looking over your child's scores, discuss recommended growth goals set forth by the College Board for the next time the PSAT or SAT is taken. Pay close attention to the color bands aligning with your child's score -- **GREEN** shows on track for college readiness, **YELLOW** indicates close to being on track for college readiness; continue to strengthen skills, and **RED** indicates a need to strengthen skills. If you have any questions, please encourage your child to see his/her school counselor (or contact our School Counseling Office). Thank you!

<u>Attention Juniors and Parents of Juniors:</u> We are offering a FREE SAT Prep opportunity for juniors ahead of our SAT School Day on March 25th! Last year, we saw a marked improvement in student scores who attended the prep sessions regularly. the Main Office and School Counseling Office, as well). These are due to the Main Office by January 24th...please take advantage of this wonderful opportunity!

Additional Notes:

- It is imperative that your child is on time for his/her exam. Students arriving late will not be permitted in the exam.
- Make Up Exams for students with Excused Absences will be held in the LMC during each exam block AND from 12-2:19. For students needing to stay until 2:19, bus transportation will be available for Griswold residents only.
- Late arrival during Exam Week: Students who have access to their own transportation AND have a study hall scheduled during the first block of the day of the exam day are not required to report to school until 9:30 AM. Students who arrive on the bus will report to their regularly assigned study hall by 7:35 AM.
- Early Dismissal during Exam Week: Students who have study hall during second testing blocks are permitted to dismiss after their first exam block ends at 9:30. However, these students will be responsible for arranging their own transportation. Students who are taking the bus home are not permitted to dismiss earlier than 12:00. All students who are leaving early will sign out in the main office before dismissing.
- **Senior Exemption** applies to seniors with a 90 or greater in a first semester class and is that teacher's discretion. Midterm exam exemption does not apply to full-year courses.
- STUDY HALLS: Students are not required to report to school for their scheduled study
 halls during exam week. All study hall students who plan on coming to school, however,
 will report to the cafeteria if it is the first exam block. If they arrive for the second exam
 block and have a scheduled study hall, then they will report to the auditorium.
