Superintendent Recommendations

Mr. Scott Faulk gave an update on Secondary Education. He stated that they are working on changes to the high school academic guide which will lead into higher level classes and will be presented at the February board meeting. The calendar committee is meeting and the State Department of Education has supplied the start dates. This will also be presented at the February meeting. January 29th will be the 6th annual Education Summit at Wiregrass Commons Mall. Several schools will be performing.

Mr. Chris Maddox wanted clarification that any changes to the high school curriculum be presented to the board before they are asked to give final approval. Mr. Scott Faulk assured the Board they would see changes before asked to vote on them.

Mr. Mike Manuel gave a Budget Update reviewing the General Fund Balance Comparison, Local Revenue Comparison, General Fund Revenues, Analysis of General Fund Expenditures and General Fund Recap. In summary all revenues are trending same as before. We had a fund balance of 5.4 million, took in 17.7 million, had 16 million operating expenses, leaving a balance of 6.8 million which equals 1.28 month. 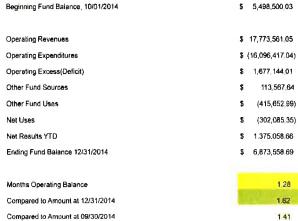


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There was short discussion about buying diesel fuel from City of Dothan and whether we were spending less for fuel.
