

FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S OFFICE:

Welcome Back Students!



The staff of TIS was thrilled to welcome students back into the building on Tuesday. The enthusiasm and positive energy from students was a welcome addition to the building. Both in-person and remote learners were able to reap the benefits of being together again.

HAWK's Nest

Our monthly HAWK's Nest focused on our January whole school attribute of empathy. Our HAWK's Nest gatherings begin with a student check in by asking them to participate in a Fist to 5. This activity simply asks students to indicate how they are feeling by holding up one through five fingers, with one indicating you are struggling and five meaning you are doing awesome. The HAWK's Nest lesson on empathy included a discussion on the definition of empathy: when someone is able to share or understand the emotions and feelings of another person. The lesson then included a story about empathy or a brief video. The culmination of the HAWK's Nest enabled students to provide examples of how they have shown empathy and how they've used their senses to determine how someone else is feeling.

1:1 Chromebook Initiative

As part of our new district Chromebook initiative, partly funded by our amazon PTO, all Tolland students will be required to have a school issued Chromebook. The only cost for the Chromebook is an optional insurance policy, as well as an option hard shell case. Below is an overview outlining the need for students to have a district issued Chromebook:

Software: There are many applications and extensions that students will be expected to have on their devices during class. The district is able to automatically install and update these apps and extensions by having student devices enrolled in the district's online device management tools. Students with personal devices may not be able to receive all of the apps that will be required for their use. Some apps, such as the state's secure testing app, only work with specific versions of ChromeOS. The district is able to ensure that student devices enrolled in its management tools stay on supported versions of ChromeOS. Update control is something the district is unable to do with personally owned devices.

Much of the software the district deploys is licensed per device. By using device management tools, the district is able to install software and license keys to devices, then remove them when they are no longer in use. On personally owned devices, the district can't verify that software has been uninstalled.

Web filtering: When students use a district device, they are required to sign in with a district-provided username and password. This information is forwarded to our web filter and allows us to easily identify which sites students are browsing. Personal devices can be logged in with non-district accounts which makes it more difficult for the district to track where students are browsing.

Grade 5 Music 2 Class: In January, the 5th grade cohort groups consisting of students from Grabowski, Racco and Yaglowski are participating in "5th grade Music with Mrs. Marchesani" class. The overarching theme is Percussion. Students have listened to recordings of percussion around the world. We are learning body percussion routines and students will be composing some as well. A variety of rhythms are being reviewed so students have plenty of rhythms

in their "rhythm bank". The culminating activity will be students bucket drumming their own compositions!

Being part of the band means that each week, students have SMALL GROUP instruction time whether you are an in-person learner or a remote learner. This year, we are using a rotating pull-out schedule during the school day. 4th grade Band Students will have their Band class on a fixed day of the week (either Tuesday or Friday) but the time of the class will change weekly. We are using special music masks and bell covers on our instruments when we play in school just like Band members in TMS and THS. Band is a graded class. 60 minutes per week of Home Practice is recommended for success and is an important commitment for students to make.




