#### WHAT'S HAPPENING IN OUR CLASSROOMS:

#### GRADE 3

We would like to thank all of the parents and families for continuing to support us during this school year. We could not do it without such wonderful families and students.

In the Journeys Reading program we have been reading stories about Thomas Edison, how technology has improved sports, and a trickster tale called Top and Bottoms. We will be moving on to a Cherokee Legend called Yonder Mountain. Third graders have been learning about idioms, homophones, verb tenses, and quotation marks. They have also been focusing on the comprehension skills of story sequence, theme, point of view, and non-fiction text features.

In our Bridges program we finished rounding numbers to the nearest ten and hundred in Unit 3. We are also spending time answering addition and subtraction problems where we need to find an estimated answer, as well as the exact answer. In Unit 4 we are working on telling time, using a number line to find elapsed time, and measurement. Making sure that your child practices math facts at home will help in our daily math. January Number Corner focused on getting more experience with fractions. We were practicing writing fractions on a number line and finding equivalent fractions. In our Calendar Collector we were collecting minutes and hours.

In late February and early March we are going to take third graders to the Wadsworth Atheneum Museum of Art in Hartford. We are going to be doing a program called "Connecticut People and Places". This will connect to our Connecticut in the 1700s and 1800s social studies units. We are excited to be able to bring parent volunteers on this trip. If you are interested in being a chaperone, please indicate that on the permission slip that goes home in the next couple of weeks. Your child's teacher will let you know if you were chosen to attend this trip with the class. Please be sure that you have filled out the Tolland BOE Volunteer form prior to the trip.

#### **GRADE 4**

Happy New Year!! It is wonderful to be back in school after what was hopefully a fun and rewarding time to spend with family and friends. The students had much to share about their winter break.

Our upcoming selections in Journeys focus on story structure, fact and opinion, understanding characters, conclusions and generalizations, and author's purpose. The students will be working on informational writing.

Fourth grade students are working diligently to master fractions and decimals, using various strategies and manipulatives. We continue to use IXL and Reflex Math to strengthen our skills, as well as FRAX to complete missions involving fractions.

In science, we are well into our second unit, which focuses on landforms and features around the world, wave patterns, and how our environment is constantly changing. The driving essential questions of this unit include:

• Why do waves affect the erosion of earth features?

• How do earth processes affect humans, and how do humans affect earth processes? Students are using background knowledge from our first unit to make connections, and they will showcase what they've learned through a performance task assessment beginning in February. Students will be developing a plan (and potentially building a small model) to help control coastline erosion. We're excited to see what they come up with! Students have been learning about world geography and map reading skills in social studies. Recently, students have begun creating their own fun-themed continents to showcase what they've learned about the features of maps. We've got some great maps in the works so far including: Ice Cream Island, Mario World, Soccerland, and so much more. Ask your 4th grader all about it! Our next until will include studies about the Northeast region, which will begin sometime in February.

We are excited to start 2023 and look forward to many learning adventures together!

#### **GRADE 5**

In Language Arts, fifth-grade students are reading "The Phantom Tollbooth," by Norton Juster. In this module of study, students investigate the way we use words to define and organize our world. We will read playful stories to investigate wordplay and answer the question: How and why do writers play with words? "The Phantom Tollbooth" is a fun and entertaining book that focuses on h umor and word play. Students are learning the difference between literal and figurative language. Students will begin writing short pieces of narrative writing and will be assigned a writing task after they have completed the novel to show their knowledge of the skills they learned. Students enjoyed learning about wordplay while listening to the "Who's on First" skit by Abbott and Costello. This is a very fun topic!

In Social Studies, students have begun the second unit, "Early Settlements and Colonization." They are investigating the essential question, "How did colonization affect and change the freedom of various groups?" They are also investigating what life was like for various groups of people after colonization. Students have also been comparing and contrasting the three regions of the English colonies (New England, Middle, Southern) during the 1600s. They are also practicing their skills using IXL.

Fifth grade mathematicians have wrapped up their unit of Place Value and Decimals. The unit included students solving real-world style problems. They learned patterns on the place value chart, fraction and decimal equivalencies, and metric conversions. Students have moved into the next unit which is Multiplication and Division of Whole Numbers and Decimals.

Students are working on their Habitat unit. The focus of this unit is on Golden Jellyfish, but also extends to the ecosystem of many different organisms. They are learning about the different parts of an ecosystem and what makes an ecosystem healthy.

#### Registration is not complete until the FRC receives the completed forms, registration fee and security deposit. You may email your completed registration forms to tollandfrc@tolland.k12.ct.us.

It is <u>especially important</u> for the FRC staff to know when your child will be absent from the preschool program. Please email your child's teacher for any absences.

- \* Monthly charges will be placed on your account in the accounting software system on the 15<sup>th</sup> of each month for the following month. All monthly invoices will be emailed on the first of the month. Please notify us if your email address changes.
- \* Tuition payments are due by the 1st of the month. A late fee of \$15.00 will be charged if paid after the 5th of the month.
- \* Parents may verify their email address with our online software payment program for the option of paying online by credit card, debit card or ACH. If you are paying by credit or with a debit card there will be a convenience fee charged to your account. Parents choosing to pay us directly by check should place the check in the payment box located at each site or mail to the Family Resource Center, 247 Rhodes Road, Tolland. Please make checks payable to the <u>Tolland</u> Board of Education.
- Children entering the 3-year-old preschool program or Preschool Plus must be 3years old by December 31, 2023.
- \* Parents are strongly encouraged to work on potty training prior to their child attending.
- \* The preschool programs follow the Tolland Public School's calendar. The programs will be closed on holidays, teacher in-service days, parent teacher conferences days and school breaks in December, February and April, and any closings due to inclement weather.

#### If you need to withdraw your child from the program or decrease the number of days your child attends, one-month notice is required. Please complete the Change in Registration Form.

# Preschool Tuition Policies 2023-2024

#### **Class Monthly Fee and Annual Fee**

Preschool Plus: 2 days - 9 monthly payments of \$278.00 or \$2,502.00 annual fee 3 days - 9 monthly payments of \$414.00 or \$3,726.00 annual fee 4 days - 9 monthly payments of \$551.00 or \$4,959.00 annual fee 3-Year-Old Preschool: 9 monthly payments of \$159.00 or \$1,431.00 annual fee

4-Year-Old Preschool: 9 monthly payments of \$286.00 or \$2,574.00 annual fee

Registration Fee: Tolland Resident: \$50.00 per child (\$75.00 maximum per family) Non-refundable

Out of Town Resident: \$75.00 per child (\$100.00 maximum per family) Non-refundable

Tuition Deposit: A one-month deposit is taken at enrollment and applied to the last month of preschool.

Sibling Discount: There is a 5% sibling discount if two or more children are enrolled in the FRC Preschool and/or School Aged Care Program.

Late Pick-Up Fee: There is a \$1.00 charge per minute for late arriving parents. Late Payment Fee A \$15.00 charge will be assessed to your account if payment is not received by the 5th of the month.

Return Check Fee: A \$20.00 charge will be assessed to your account for checks returned for non-sufficient funds.

Withdrawal from Program: If you need to withdraw your child from the program, one month's written notice must be given to the coordinator. If less than one month is given, your deposit will be forfeited and will be used towards the balance on your child's account. If you choose to withdraw prior to August 1, 2023, your deposit will be refunded in full. After August 1, 2023, your initial deposit will not be refunded.

# Send in the smocks today!

**Grade 3** During the month of January the third graders will be working on **Snowman** Locker Buddies. This project is made from 2 paper plates, yarn, and construction paper. Students will design a head of a snowman. Each snowman will have a pocket so students could store items inside of it.

In the middle of January, we will be starting a **Clay Coil project**. Students will design a **base shape** and finish the rest of the clay project by **coiling up clay**, 4 or **5 coils high**. The clay project will then need to dry before firing it in the **kiln**. After the clay project has been fired we will glaze it with <u>two colors of glaze</u>.

**Grade 4** The fourth graders will be starting up their **Styrofoam Printing Projects**. The first printing project will be a **proof print using black ink.** After the **proof** is made students can check their printing block for errors. Once the errors have been corrected, other colored prints can be made. Each print will be labeled with the student's name, number of the print, and a title of the print.

**Grade 5** The fifth graders will be working finishing their 3D Letters. The letters are starting to come alive with color! Each student will draw ten things about them on their letter. After the drawing step is finished students will then begin to paint their letters using acrylic paint. This paint does not come out of clothes. All students are asked to wear a smock during class!

**Hello Parents.** In the art room, students will <u>not</u> be permitted to wear their winter coats in class. Please, send a smock to protect and cover your child's clothes. The art room is used by three different grades and there are messy projects going on all the time.
