A. Danbury Public Schools Strategic Plan 2022-2027

MOTION: B. Guertin moved and K. Conetta second that the Board of Education approve the Danbury Public Schools Strategic Plan 2022-2027 in accordance with 22-119(pg.30)

• T. Buzaid said she has a problem with Action Steps #3 of teaching and learning. She doesn't like the language of "Develop a process to ensure both curriculum and resources

- to support implementation are inclusive and culturally relevant." Her point is that education should be equal for all, we are a melting pot and diverse.
- K. Casimiro explained that all students need to have access to the same education and that all students feel included and supported. We have worked hard to offer a diverse approach and engagement for all students.
- T. Buzaid asked to see a list of the authors.
- K. Truchsess reiterated that all students need to feel a sense of belonging in the school community. Students are aware that not everyone is the same but that is ok.
- G. Cooper added that Board members can say that they disapprove but how do we go about changing it.
- B. Guertin stated that cultural relevancy adds to the curriculum.
- K. Casimiro added that this is a nationwide initiative to make sure that we are addressing the needs of all of our students. This is meant to enrich the curriculum and adding more substance to it.
- K. Conetta said she is looking at "Strengthen and make curriculum accessible for all and include enrichment and interventions to improve academic outcomes". My takeaway from this statement is improving the curriculum by making it more inclusive and creating opportunities for all of our students to improve academic achievement.
- R. Pietrafesa asked, just to be clear we are not watering down the curriculum, we are just making it more accessible.
- T. Buzaid said she doesn't see how culture has to do with math.
- G. Cooper added that it is hard to satisfy everyone.
- A. Russo asked, are we segregating our students.
- K. Casimiro explained, when we are reading a story to all students, we try to offer a diverse offering of genres and authors so that all students can relate to the content.
- L. Zagottis-Britton added, to achieve the goals we need to allow these action steps to do the work that they need to do to reach all students.
- M. Coelho said, when you break it down it is a more individualistic approach.
- K. Casimiro added that most people want their kids to grow up in a rich and diverse environment. She explained "it helps students become more well-rounded and they appreciate the education they get in DPS".
- M. Coelho said, it would be great to see a list and curriculum.
- K. Casimiro added that she looks to provide a variety.
- B. Guertin asked if all curriculum includes music and art as well.
- K. Casimiro said, that yes you will see a reflection of that.
- L. Daly stated that bringing variety creates excitement.
