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**Additional requirements for admission to a university in Washington State:**

- Two years of the same World Language (three recommended)
- Some universities require one year of an algebra-based science (Chemistry or Physics)
- A math or math-based quantitative course taken during senior year  
Students are exempt from this rule if they complete Pre-Calculus **prior** to senior year
- University admission requirements are subject to change and may vary. Students and families should contact universities to verify admission requirements.

**Career Pathway:** 2.0 credits in an approved CTE Course Sequence

**Additional considerations if you plan to attend college:**

*Washington State universities have admission requirements called College Academic Distribution Requirements ([CADRs](#)). Some CADRs require advance planning:*

**Plan to complete 2.0 World Language credits (or 3.0 for competitive schools)**

Make sure you start by 10<sup>th</sup> or 11<sup>th</sup> grade, so you have time to finish by graduation

**Plan to take a quantitative course senior year for admission to WA universities**

Take a math-based class during senior year: a math course, an algebra-based science, or AP Computer Science.\*



*\*Students can fulfill this requirement by completing Pre-Calculus before 12<sup>th</sup> grade*

*\*Algebra-based science courses taken during senior year will complete both the Science Elective requirement for high school graduation, as well as the senior year quantitative course requirement for university admission.*

## ONLINE Registration Directions for Rogers High School

Prior to online registration, please review your transcript in HAC (click grades, transcript, then “right click” to print). In Next, complete a Grad Requirement Worksheet: [Grad Link](#)  
Once you’ve completed these steps, you are ready for registration!



- 1) Log onto your PSD district device (this will not work from your cell phone)
- 2) Select the **Clever** dashboard 
- 3) Select the Home Access Center icon 
- 4) Select the **CLASSES** icon at the top of the screen.
- 5) Click **2022-2023 COURSE REQUESTS** to start the process of selecting your classes.
  - Note: If you scroll to the bottom of this screen, you will see a list of your remaining graduation requirements and what you have completed.
- 6) Next, use the **Course Selection Sheet** and **Registration Worksheet** as a reference for what you will select in HAC.
- 7) Click the **EDIT** tab for ENGLISH
- 8) Check the **Request** box for the English class you wish to take and click **SAVE**.
- 9) Repeat this process for Social Studies and Science (depending on your grade level)
- 10) If you have not completed your minimum math requirements for graduation, a math recommendation has been pre-loaded by your math teacher. \*If you desire a different math class, please discuss this with your current math teacher.
- 11) Continue selecting your **CORE** class requests by clicking the **EDIT** tab at the end of the subject areas.
- 12) For **Elective Classes** check the **Request** box next to the class you wish to take, click **SAVE**.
- 13) Continue selecting your requests until you reach a **TOTAL of 6.0 credits**.
- 14) Next, **select a minimum of 3.0 ELECTIVE ALTERNATES** by clicking the **EDIT** tab at the end of the subject area of your choice (you **MUST** choose alternates for your elective choices)
- 15) Check the **Request** box next to the class you wish to take, but this time you must use the drop down to identify this course as an “**Alternate to Any Course**” and click **SAVE**
- 16) After you have completed your course selections for registration, **SAVE** and log-out! 😊

Students have until **March 1<sup>st</sup>** to sign back in to make any changes to your requests.

# Frequently Asked Questions about



## ***How do I sign into my Home Access Center (HAC) account?***

Log onto your PSD district device and select the CLEVER dashboard. Then click on **Home Access Center**. From here, click the **Classes** icon and scroll down and select **REQUESTS**

## ***How can I look up my transcript?***

Sign on to Home Access Center (see directions above), click the **Grades** icon, then click on **Transcript**. "Right click" to print if you would like to print a copy.

## ***What classes are offered at Rogers?***

Courses for the next school year will be viewable in HAC when registering online. Classes are also listed on the RHS Course Selection Sheet, accessible online through our website [2022-2023 Courses Offered at RHS](#). You will also be able to view brief videos of various RHS programs on our school website.
