Three types of college ready ...



Satisfied all the CSU admissions requirements

EAP

Able to succeed academically in college-level classes

content ready

functionally ready

Able to successfully cope with demands and responsibilities of college

4 different options to demonstrate





Option #1 <u>Smarter Balance Assessment</u>

(Taken in 11th grade)

Measures college readiness in English and math

Ready Status - Met EPT/ELM requirement

<u>Conditional</u> Status - Need to get C or better both semesters in CSU approved "Senior Year Course"

Not Yet Ready Status_- Use other options to demonstrate readiness or take EPT/ELM

Option #2 Standardized Tests

(Taken in 11th or 12th grade)

Test	CSU <u>Ready</u> Cut Score	** CSU Conditional Cut Score
SAT Math	550	490
SAT Reading	500	460
ACT Math	23	20
ACT English	22	19
Math/English AP	3, 4 or 5	N/A

^{**} Requires approved 12th grade course with at least C grade in both semesters to demonstrate readiness

Option #3 CSU Placement Test

To be taken if neither option #1 nor option #2 satisfied

ELM

Score 50 or above on Entry Level Mathematics exam

EPT

Score 147 or above on English Placement Test

Option #4 Early Start Program

Mandatory for all students who have not yet demonstrated college readiness through Options 1-3

Participate in the Early Start Program in English and/or mathematics during the summer between high school and college.



Understanding the Standards

- Standard Exceeded-Ready for English/math college level coursework
 - Student does not need to take the CSU's English and/or math placement exams.
 - ► May enroll directly in college credit bearing courses.
 - ► CSU's Early Start Program not required.

Understanding the Standards

- Standard nearly Met Not yet ready
 - ► Must take CSU's English and/or math placement tests.
 - Likely required to participate in CSU's Early Start Program
- Standard Not Met Not ready

Understanding the Standards

- Standard Met Conditionally Ready for English/math college level coursework
 - Student does not need to take the CSU's English and/or math placement exams. However,
 - Student must participate in CSU's Early Start Program, UNLESS
 - Student participated in an approved senior year-long course and earned a grade of C or higher, or met the condition through another pathway.
 - If so, then,
 - Student may enroll directly in college credit bearing courses.

Approved Courses for Conditionally Ready Students

- CSU will use approved English and math courses to meet the EAP conditional status.
 - English: Expository Reading and Writing (ERWC), AP, Honors, IB
 - Math: courses with Alg. II or IM III as a pre-requisite.
- Courses must have been adopted through the UC Course Management Portal process.

- Alg. II or IM III no longer an approved senior year course.

UC's A-G Course Management Portal

- Official title: CSU Expository Reading and Writing
- Official abbreviation: ERWC
- Must a school use the official title?
 - Yes, if the school wants to make it easy for office of admissions to identify the course
 - Cannot guarantee that variations of the official title will be honored

EXEMPT

from EPT and/or ELM and CSU Early Start Program

May enroll directly in college level courses upon admission to a CSU

"Ready" or "Exempt" Standardized Tests/ CSU Placement Test

- Students are not required to participate in the Early Start Program
- Students are eligible to College-Level courses
- May require additional testing for College-Level placement

"CONDITIONALLY READY"

For English and Math college level courses

CAASPP EAP: Standard Met

English: ACT: 19-21, SAT: 460-490

Math: ACT: 20-22, SAT: 490-540



COMPLETE

an approved senior year-long English course:

ERWC, AP or IB, or Weighted Honors English



COMPLETE

an approved senior year-long math course:

All courses with a prerequisite of Algebra II or Integrated Math III, including: Trigonometry, Math Analysis, Pre-Calculus or Calculus, AP Calculus AB or BC, AP Physics or AP Statistics

"Conditionally Ready" or "Conditionally Exempt"

- Must earn a "C" or better in both semesters
- Highly encouraged to take ELM and/or EPT
- Students who complete their conditional requirement will become "Exempt" and considered College-Ready

- Official transcripts for Conditional Ready students should be sent as soon as possible
- SAT/ACT cutoff scores for EAP Conditional (Umbrella)
- EAP results have **no** impact on CSU admission decisions
- Students need to fill in CSU bubble to release EAP results.
- EAP results are available online for students to view or download only if released. http://www.csuenglishsuccess.org/eap_results
- EAP results not released are still valid but must be submitted separately: <u>www.ets.org/csu/about/eap/</u>
- EAP results will be available approximately 4-weeks after testing
- 11th grade portal: http://www.csusuccess.org/juniors
- EAP results have a one year shelf life.
