4-year COLLEGE REQUIREMENTS

Minimum college requirements include C grade or higher in the following classes (level CP or higher):

"a" History/Social Studies – 2 or more years

- "b" English 4 years
- "c" Mathematics 3 or more years
- "d" Laboratory Science 2 or more years
- "e" Language Other Than English (LOTE) 2 or more years
- "f" Visual/Performing Arts (VPA) 1 year
- "g" College Preparatory Electives 1 year

4-year COLLEGE TESTING

Required (SAT or ACT):

SAT Reasoning Test – Should be taken in Spring of 11th grade year.

ACT (with writing) - Should be taken in Spring of 11th grade year.

Recommended:

PSAT: Should be taken in October of 10th and 11th grades. **SAT Subject Test**: Advisable to take Subject Tests as early as the end of 10th grade if student is enrolled in a corresponding AP class for the year or to validate LOTE if student is fluent in a 2nd language.
