11th Grade Syllabus

Course Description: English III is a course designed to not only meet, but to exceed, the state and district standards in English Language Arts. This course emphasizes further development in the areas of reading, writing, language conventions, and listening and speaking within a curriculum that adheres to California Common Core Standards for English Language Arts. Students will be exposed to a variety of American Literary genres, including poetry, drama, short stories, novels and non-fiction texts. They will also compose argumentative, narrative, and informational pieces of writing.

Make-up Homework Policy:
