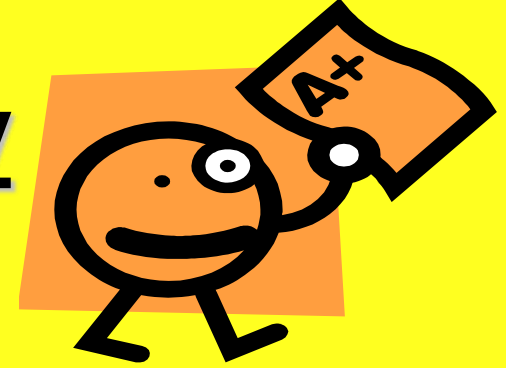

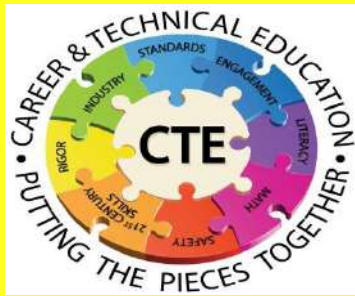

CTE PATHWAYS

Career Technical Education



- Foothill offers CTE pathways that give students the opportunity to explore and become skilled in one of nine areas of study. In order to complete a pathway and graduate with a pathway cord, students must take 3-4 courses in that field, including at least one introductory, one focus, and one completer course in the same area.
- I= Introductory
- F= Focus Course
- C= Completer Course

*Optional electives can be used as the intro or focus courses or can be taken as an elective in addition to other coursework.

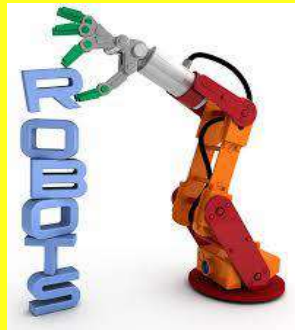
