Credits

- You receive **credits** for each class you pass with a D or higher
- Each semester class is worth 5 credits
- You must have 230 credits to graduate
- If you receive a **D** or **F** in a core academic course, you will need to recover the class in summer school.



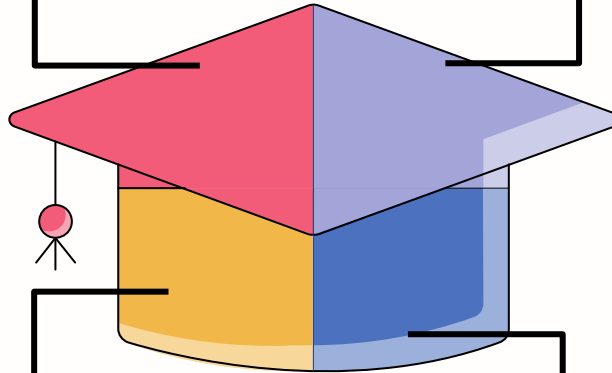

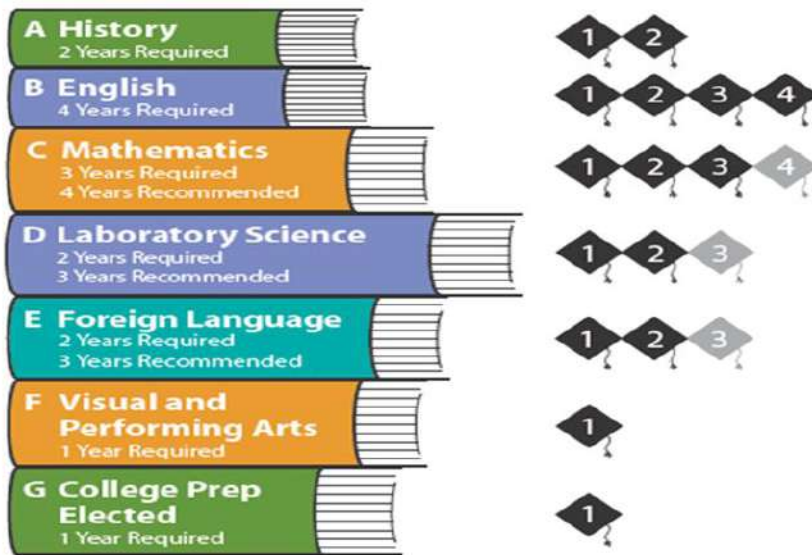

What are A-G Requirements?

- Sequence of high school courses
- Required for freshmen entering the UC, CSU, and some Private Universities
- Must be pass classes with a grade of 'C' or higher



* Grades of C or better required.

A-G Requirements

Course	Years Required
A. History	2 years required
B. English	4 years required
C. Math (Algebra 1, Geometry & Algebra 2)	3 years required <i>4 years recommended</i>
D. Science	2 years required <i>3 years recommended</i>
E. Foreign Language (French, Spanish, Latin) <i>*must be the same language*</i>	2 years required <i>3 years recommended</i>
F. Visual and Performing Arts	1 year required
G. Elective	1 year required

**All A-G courses must be passed with a grade of a "C" or better*



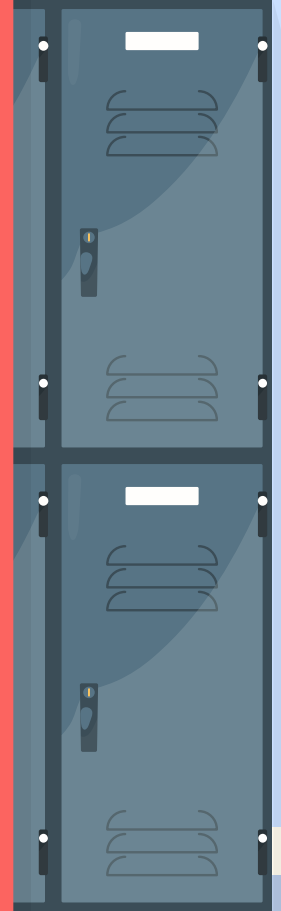

Class Levels: Honors and Advanced Placement

- Classes cover advanced materials and have more in-depth study
- Grade is “weighted” when students receive an A,B, or C
Example: A **‘C’** in an AP course is equivalent to a **‘B’** in a non-AP course.
- AP= College level class, culminating in a rigorous exam
(opportunity to earn college credit)
- Strong study habits

State Seal of Biliteracy

The State Seal of Biliteracy (SSB), marked by a gold seal on the diploma, recognizes high school graduates who have attained a high level of proficiency in speaking, reading, and writing one or more languages in addition to English.



ELIGIBILITY

Requirement A

Pass

11th grade ELA CAASPP with *Standard Met or Above*

**If 11th grade ELA CAASPP scores are not available, a local standards-based assessment can be used.*

Requirement B

Complete

four years of English with an overall GPA of 2.0 or above

Requirement C

Demonstrate

proficiency in a language other than English through ONE of the following methods:

- Pass a World Language Advanced Placement exam with a minimum score of a 3
- Pass the International Baccalaureate examination with a minimum score of a 4
- Pass the SAT II World Language Exam with a score of 600 or higher
- Successfully complete a four-year course of study (equivalent to taking level 4 or higher) in world language with a minimum GPA average of 3.0 *AND* passing an Oral Exam

Requirement D

Demonstrate

proficiency on the English Language Proficiency Assessment California (ELPAC)

***Students taking Latin, or qualifying students of languages not taught at TUSD, will complete an alternate assessment.**

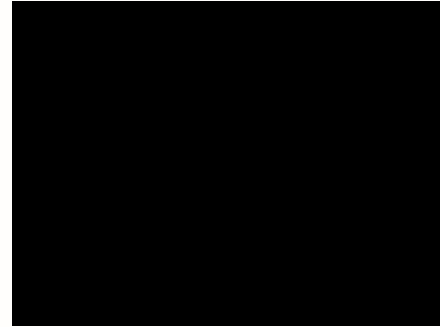
