Graduation Requirements

Santiago High graduates are required to earn a minimum of 220 credits, five for each semester class passed with a “D” or better.

These include:

- 8 semesters of Language Arts
- 4 semesters of Math
- 4 semesters of Science
- 2 semesters of World History, 2 semesters of U.S. History, 1 semester of Government, and 1 semester of Economics
- 2 semesters Visual/ Performing Arts or 2 semesters of World Language
- 4 semesters of Physical Education
- 1 semester of Health
- 75 additional elective credits

In the 2016-17 school year Santiago participated in **SBAC** testing for the third time.

78% of the students tested in the Summative ELA test met the achievement standard. Up 14% from 2014-2015.

51% of the students tested in the Summative Math test met the achievement standard. Up 18% from 2014-2015.
