Your Demonstration

at beginning, middle or end of presentation

- Ideas
 - Role Play
 - Ex: dental hygienist, chemist
 - Interview a professional on the job
 - Accountant, Coast Guard Gunner's Mate
 - Live Demonstration
 - Computer repair, chef
 - Video a Day in the life of a...
 - Firefighter, marketing director, x ray tech
- Demonstrations should be 3 – 4 minutes
