TUSD GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- 220 Credits to graduate from Tracy Unified School District
 - > English: 40 Credits
 - > Mathematics: 20 Credits (including Algebra I)
 - > Social Science: 30 Credits
 - > Science: 30 Credits (Biology, Chemistry and Physics)
 - > Physical Education: 20 Credits
 - > Fine Arts or Foreign Language: 10 Credits
 - > Electives: 70 Credits

WHAT ARE THE A-G REQUIREMENTS?

- Classes that students must complete by the end of high school to be eligible to attend a university in California
 - > California State Universities
 - > Universities of California
- There is a **minimum of 15 classes** which students must take to meet the a-g requirements
 - > For UC consideration, 11 of these courses must be completed by the end of 11th grade.

23 CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITIES (CSU)

1. Are placement tests required? **Currently CSUs are using SAT/ACT tests for placement. Some programs require additional tests, portfolios or auditions.**
2. Are SAT/ACT required for admission? **Typically YES, however...**
The California State University (CSU) has temporarily suspended the use of ACT/SAT examinations to determine admission eligibility for all CSU campuses for the 2022-2023 academic year. This temporary change of admission eligibility might change 2023-2024 academic year.
3. Are A-G courses required for admission? **YES**
(a-g required courses must be completed with grades of C or better)
4. Is there a GPA minimum for admission? **YES**
2.5 GPA is a minimum (**2.0-2.49 GPA** each campus will have its own supplemental requirements for this GPA range)
5. Is there an application for admission? **YES**



9 University of California (UC)

1. Are placement tests required? Currently UCs are using SAT/ACT tests for placement. Some programs require additional tests, portfolios or auditions.
2. Are SAT/ACT required for admission? Currently no, but that might change for next year.
3. Are A-G courses required for admission? YES
(a-g required courses must be completed with grades of C or better)
4. Is there a GPA minimum for admission? YES
3.0 GPA is the minimum

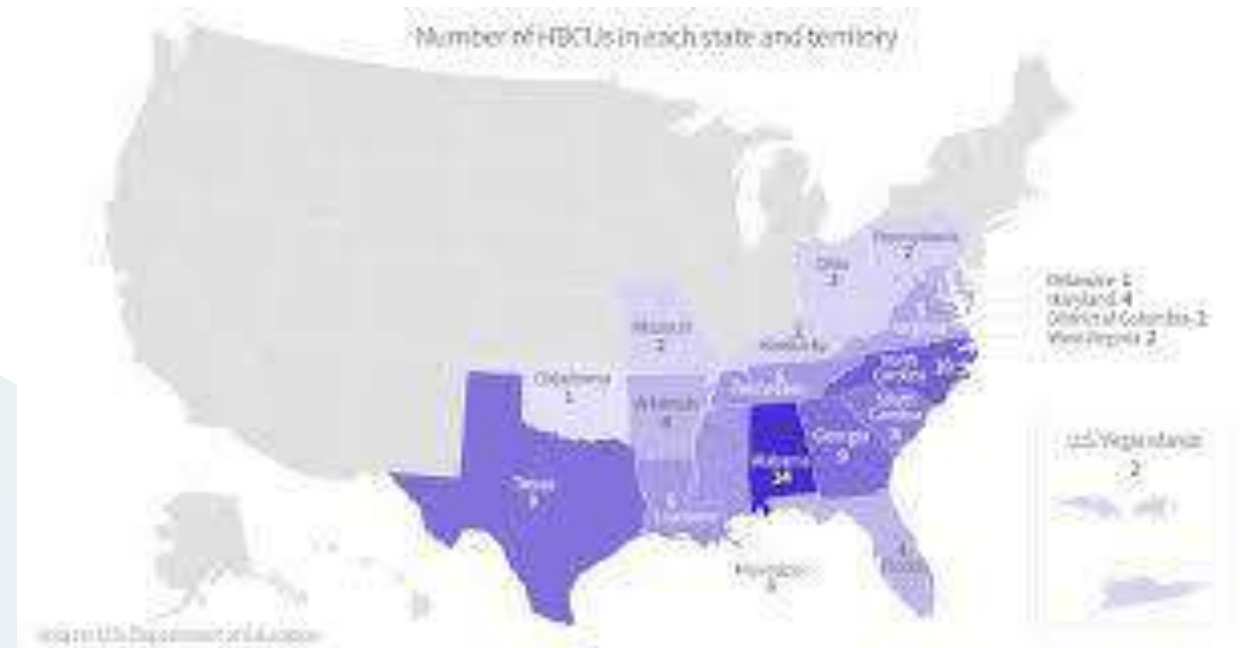

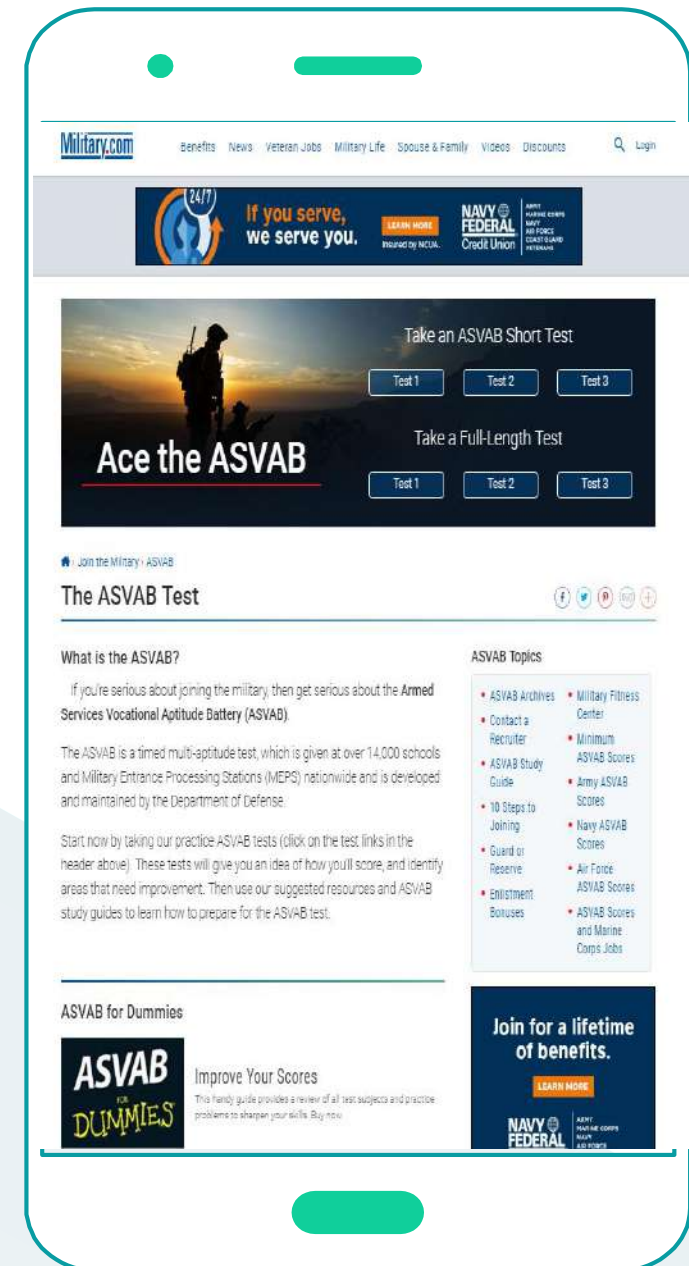
