

Course Description

Course Description

In this course, we will examine the pivotal moments that shaped the modern world, from the late 18th century to our time! We will trace the emergence of democratic ideas and develop an understanding of the historical roots of current world problems, especially in regard to the international relations of the United States. The study of history is essential to being an influential citizen and to understanding the role of the United States in our changing world. Guiding questions throughout the year:

- ★ How did ideas associated with the Enlightenment, the Scientific Revolution, the Age of Reason, and a variety of democratic revolutions develop and impact civil society?
- ★ Why did imperial powers seek to expand their empires? how did colonies respond? What were the legacies of these conquests?
- * Why was the modern period defined by global conflict and cooperation, economic growth and collapse, and global independence and connection?



Dual Language Immersion

This class is part of the Dual Immersion pathway and as such, the content is delivered in Spanish and class interactions are mainly in Spanish. This course will fulfill student's A-G, graduation and DLI requirements.

How we practice listening and speaking:

- Lectures are all delivered in Spanish
- Class discussions are in Spanish
- Students are to use their newly acquired vocabulary to express themselves
- Students are expected to speak in Spanish during class

How we practice reading:

- Textbook is in Spanish and students have assigned readings.
- Primary and secondary documents are in Spanish (usually read during class time)

How we practice writing:

- Students are expected to write short answer responses on daily interactive activities in Spanish...
- Essays will be given at the end of each unit to assess students knowledge and understanding of the material taught. Essays will be written in Spanish. A peer review and editing process will be applied prior to submitting their final essays.


