College Admission Process

- □ Research your schools of interest early
- □ Seek help early throughout the application process
- □ Complete all application material and letters of recommendation before the published deadline
- □ Check your email and university portals often
- □ Order official transcripts from the guidance techs in a timely manner
- □ Follow all instructions regarding placement tests
- □ Call college admissions office for advice when you aren't sure what to do next

- Sign up for SAT and or ACT
- Know the difference between UC, CSU, Private & Community Colleges
- Know the application deadlines & apply early
- Do you need a recommendation letter?

College Admission Testing

SAT Reasoning:

Used to measure verbal, math, and writing abilities.

ACT:

Measures
English, Math,
Social Science, &
Natural Sciences.

SAT2 Subject:

Specific subject tests (i.e.-Social Sciences, Sciences, Foreign Languages, etc.)*



*No longer required for UC schools. May be required for a supplemental application for the major you are applying to.

Current SAT vs. New SAT

| | Current SAT | New SAT |
|---------|--|---|
| Format | 3 Sections = Math, Critical Reading, Writing (Essay) | 2 Sections = Math, Reading/Writing (Essay is optional) |
| Points | 2400 = Math 200-800, CR 200-800, Writing 200-800 | 1600 = Math 200-800, R/W 200-800 |
| Essay | Required, 25 minutes, beginning of test, personal stance | Optional, 50 minutes, end of test, analysis of source text |
| Vocab | Knowledge of isolated terms | Knowledge of terms within context |
| Content | Aptitude of broad range of concepts | Assessment of concepts specific to college readiness |
| Scoring | 1 pt. for each correct answer, ¼ pt. deduction for each incorrect answer | 1pt. for each correct answer, no deductions for incorrect answers |
| Fees | \$54.50 | \$54.50 w/ essay, \$43 w/out essay |


