

INTERDISTRICT ATTENDANCE

The Governing Board recognizes that parents/guardians of students who reside within the geographic boundaries of one district may, for a variety of reasons, desire to enroll their children in a school in another district.

Interdistrict Attendance Agreements and Permits

The Board may enter into an agreement with any other school district, for a term not to exceed five school years, for the interdistrict attendance of students who are residents of the districts. (Education Code 46600)

The agreement shall specify the terms and conditions under which interdistrict attendance shall be permitted or denied. It also may contain standards agreed to by both districts for reapplication and/or revocation of the student's permit. (Education Code 46600)

Upon receiving a permit for transfer into the district that has been approved by the student's district of residence, or upon receiving a written request from the parent/guardian of a district student who wishes to enroll in another district, the Superintendent or designee shall review the request and may approve or deny the permit subject to the terms and conditions of the interdistrict attendance agreement.

Effective as of the 2013-2014 school year, the district does not accept residency based on a parent or guardian's employment within district boundaries under Education Code Section 48204, subdivision (b), commonly known as the 'Allen Bill.' The district grants interdistrict attendance only through its interdistrict transfer application process pursuant to Board Policy and Administrative Regulation 5117 and Education Code Section 46600 et seq. All interdistrict transfers granted are for one school year only and a request for interdistrict transfer must be resubmitted annually. Students admitted to the district under the Allen Bill prior to 2013-2014, however, may attend school in the district through 12th grade so long as a parent or guardian continues to be employed within district boundaries at least 10 hours during the school week.

Effective as of the 2022-23 school year, once an interdistrict transfer for a student in grades TK-12, inclusive, has been approved from the Menifee Union School District or the Temecula Valley Unified School District, the student shall not have to reapply for an interdistrict transfer, and the governing board of the school district of enrollment shall allow the pupil to continue to attend at the school in which the pupil is enrolled through the end of the grade-span (TK-5, 6-8, 9-12).

INTERDISTRICT ATTENDANCE (continued)**Transportation**

The district shall not provide transportation beyond any school attendance area. Upon request of a student's parent/guardian, the Superintendent or designee may authorize transportation for an interdistrict transfer student to and from designated bus stops within the attendance area of the school that the student attends if space is available.
