
Meeting with student and parent takes place to sign an At-Risk/Extra Credit contract. SST's may be scheduled if deemed appropriate.

After we have exhausted all options then transfer paper work is prepared.

PSAT 10th GRADE TESTING

While many of you may have heard rumors of the PSAT coming to DHS; we are pleased to announce that it is. On October 11th, 10th grade students who had a weighted GPA of 2.0 and above last year will be taking the test. This number comes out to 375 of the 536 sophomores we have here at DHS.

Scores from this testing date will be available online for students on December 11th. The score report from the PSAT gives students a bar graph indicating whether the student is on track for college readiness. The sum of students two section scores can range from: 320–1520. The data from this test is a great indicator for strengths and weaknesses in a student's Math and English levels. If you know any students that would like to take a practice-PSAT they are offered through many website, but Khan Academy PSAT Prep is highly recommended and easiest to access.

WHAT IS THE FRESH START PROGRAM?

Counseling department selected 30-9th grade students who volunteered to join our Fresh Start Program. This program offers students 3 days of rotating intervention tutorials with a Math, English, Science teacher on Monday, Wednesday, and Thursday. Attendance is mandatory. After 3 negative attendance marks students are dropped and the next student on the waiting list is selected. The goal is to help students improve their grades in these core classes and prevent them from failing 1st Semester.
