

- Additional Scholarship opportunities





- Recommended to be taken at least twice by students
 - > Spring, 11th grade
 - > Fall, 12th grade

PUSD Background

- All 11th graders took the PSAT at PHS for free during the school day in 2015
- About 250 9th graders took the PSAT at PHS West during the school day in 2015
- About 30 8th graders took the PSAT at Zamboni for free during the school day in 2015
- Students who took the SAT last year signed up on their own, took it on a Saturday somewhere, and paid for it themselves
 - June, 2016 190 students
 - ➤ May, 2016 51 students
 - ➤ March, 2016 77 students
