The Ohio Department of Health requires all 12th graders receive the Meningococcal (serogroup ACWY, Menactra, MCV4, Menveo) vaccine. Children will not be permitted to start 12th grade without proper proof of the meningococcal vaccine.

Please contact your child's physician to ensure the vaccine was administered and obtain an updated immunization record for school. If your child has not received the meningococcal vaccine and you do not have a regular physician or need financial assistance please see the clinic opportunities listed below to schedule an appointment. This page can be completed by the physician or clinic and sent to the WKHS Health Office as proof that the meningococcal requirement has been met. (See contact info below)

Please notify the Health Office if there is a medical or personal reason why your student cannot receive the Meningococcal vaccine so their health record can be updated or if your student has an upcoming appointment.

- Meningococcal B
