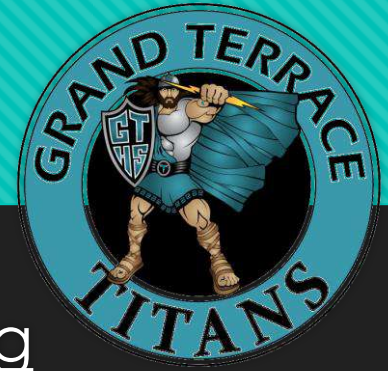

Senior Contract Requirements



Disqualifying Components

- Seniors may not have more than 9 tardies.
- Seniors may not have more than 9 unverified absences.
- Seniors must not be suspended for any reason.

Re-Qualifying

- Attend Saturday Schools
 - Get list from AP Office or Website.
 - 1st Semester absences must be made-up during 1st Semester.
 - Only 2nd Semester absences can be cleared up in the 2nd Semester.
- Attend after-school tutoring
 - Monday, Tuesday, & Thursday
 - Reduces one tardy or one unverified absence per hour.
- Lunch Isolation in Study Hall
 - Clears up one UNV or one Tardy for every two served.

Concurrent Enrollment Program

What is Concurrent Enrollment?



- The High School Concurrent Enrollment Program at San Bernardino Valley College allows eligible students to enroll in college courses and earn both high school and college credit simultaneously.
- Participating students not only get a “taste” of college, but also get a head start on their college career.
- Students complete assignments in the same manner as “regularly” admitted students and are given a final grade that is posted on their SBVC official college transcript.

What are the advantages of participating in Concurrent Enrollment?



According to the Community College Research Center at Columbia University, students participating in high school concurrent programs (also known as dual enrollment programs) increase their likelihood of:

- earning a high school diploma
- enrolling and attending full-time as regular college students
- persisting to degree completion
- earning higher GPAs as freshmen college students
- earning a higher number of college credits than non-concurrent enrollment students

What are the advantages of participating in Concurrent Enrollment?



- Save time!
 - Courses will remain on your transcript and are eligible* to transfer to a 4 year university.
- Save money!
 - The Concurrent Enrollment Program is virtually free for high school students!*

SDEV 103- CAREER EXPLORATION & LIFE PLANNING (3 UNITS)

Sept. 5-Dec. 8

Tuesday & Thursday (3:30-5:20pm)

This course is an in-depth study in career and life planning designed for students seeking direction in setting life, academic and career goals. A holistic perspective will be used to highlight the person-environment dynamics crucial to well-rounded preparation for a fulfilling career and life-span developmental achievements. Topics will include major choices, interviewing skills, cover letter and resume writing, and labor market trends.

Credit Awarded



What credit is awarded for SBVC courses offered off-site?

- SBVC awards college credit (units) per the course outline of record
- SBVC course credits (for transferable courses) transfer to most colleges and universities

High School Credit

- Your high school administrators will determine the credit and units you receive towards high school requirements

Are the courses easier for high school students?

The expectations for academic rigor and course quality are exactly the same as for all courses offered through SBVC.

Frequently Asked Questions



What are the eligibility requirements?

- Must have completed the 8th grade (or will complete by start of term and be at least 13 years of age)
- All concurrent enrollment students must have at least a 2.0 GPA to participate in the program.
- Students in **9th -12th** grade with an academic GPA of 2.0 and passing grades in similar courses can enroll in vocational courses (0-99).
- To enroll in transfer level courses (100-299) students must be in the **11th or 12th** grade with a GPA of 3.0 or higher and have passing grades in similar courses.

Frequently Asked Questions



What are the costs associated with the program?

The enrollment fees are FREE* for all students physically attending high school in California; a savings of \$138 to \$276 for a typical high school Concurrent Enrollment Program participant.

Students are responsible for all other fees (e.g., course materials, books, health & accident fee, student representation fee, transportation fee and Student ASB card (optional), etc). For more information concerning fees, please visit:

Frequently Asked Questions



What if I change my mind? Can I stop taking the class?

- Yes. This is known as a “drop” or “dropping” a course.
- It is the student's responsibility to drop their class.
- You should drop by the first 20 percent of the class. No entry will be made on the student's record for dropping a class prior to the 20% deadline.
- A student who withdraws or is dropped from a course before 60 percent of the class has been completed will not receive a letter grade. Instead, the letter W (withdrawal) will be recorded on the student's transcript.
- If a student is still enrolled after the 60% the student will receive the grade earned in the course.
- **The drop/withdraw dates can be found on the student registration statement.**

Frequently Asked Questions



Does a parent have access to student records (grades, attendance, etc.)?

Student's Right to Privacy

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) of 1974 protects the privacy of a student's education records by placing limits on whom may have access to the records, what information may be shared or disclosed, and how that information may be used. San Bernardino Valley College complies with FERPA and has strict policies and procedures in place governing student records.

Because high school concurrent enrollment students are considered college students (even if underage), SBVC does not permit access to their education records or disclose information in them to anyone (including parents) without the student's written consent. The student must complete and sign a release of information form before records will be released.

Frequently Asked Questions



When will I find out if I have been admitted to the program?

Once we have reviewed your application packet and determined everything is in order. We will let you know if you do not qualify for specific courses either by emailing or speaking with you. But you will receive an email telling you for which courses you were approved.

How to apply



1. Complete the SBVC Concurrent Enrollment Application
2. Complete the SBVC online application
3. Complete the orientation
4. Complete the Accuplacer Assessment Test
5. Register for your class

- SBVC staff will be back at your high school in a few days to help you with the application, orientation, assessment and registration
- Speak with your high school staff for dates and to sign up for the sessions.
- We will only hold one session per high school. Make sure you are in attendance and on time.

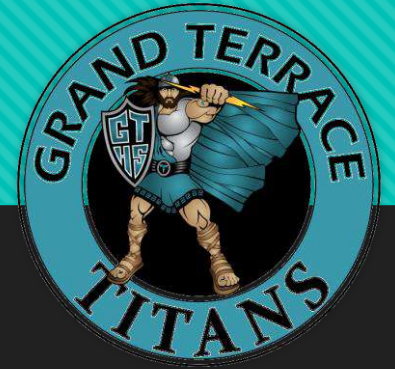
