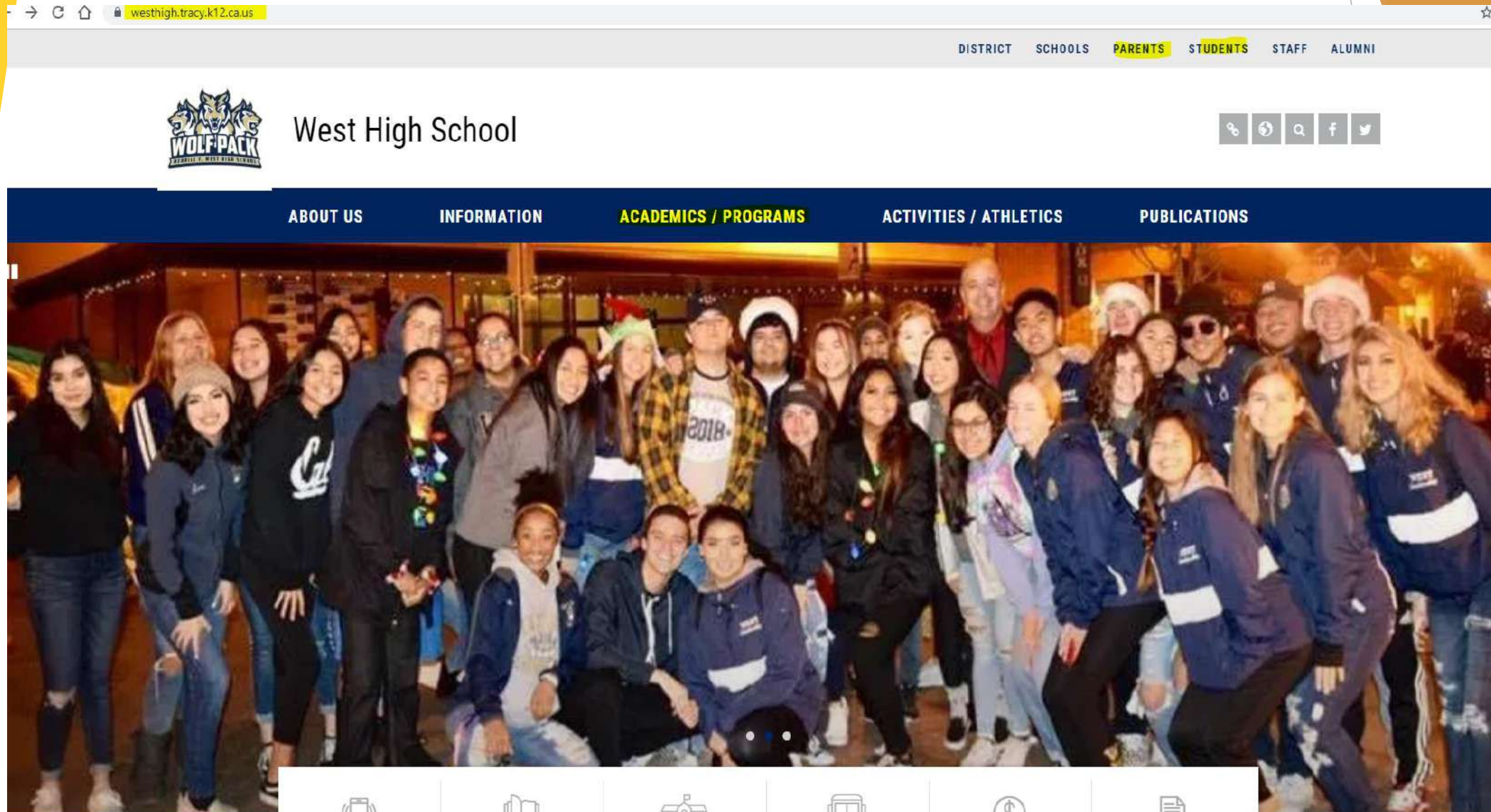

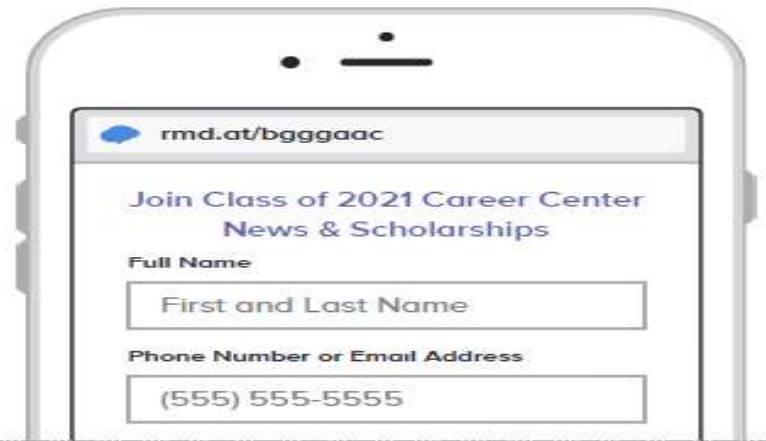

HOW DO I QUALIFY?

- ▶ If you are a California resident and rank in the top 9 percent of students in your California high school class — and your high school participates in our ELC program — you may be eligible for ELC designation.

When will I find out if I'm designated ELC?

- ▶ As an applicant from California, your application will be automatically screened for ELC eligibility when you apply. There's no extra paperwork.
- ▶ After submitting the application, you can return to the *My UC Application* page to see whether or not you've been designated as being in the top 9 percent of your class.

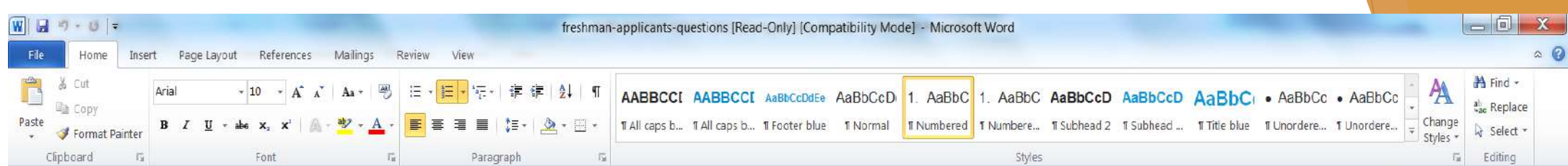

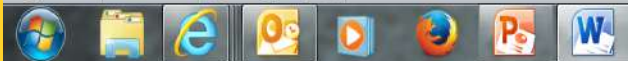

Freshman applicants: Personal insight questions

Answer any 4 of the following 8 questions:

1. Describe an example of your leadership experience in which you have positively influenced others, helped resolve disputes, or contributed to group efforts over time.
2. Every person has a creative side, and it can be expressed in many ways: problem solving, original and innovative thinking, and artistically, to name a few. Describe how you express your creative side.
3. What would you say is your greatest talent or skill? How have you developed and demonstrated that talent over time?
4. Describe how you have taken advantage of a significant educational opportunity or worked to overcome an educational barrier you have faced.
5. Describe the most significant challenge you have faced and the steps you have taken to overcome this challenge. How has this challenge affected your academic achievement?
6. Describe your favorite academic subject and explain how it has influenced you.
7. What have you done to make your school or your community a better place?
8. What is the one thing that you think sets you apart from other candidates applying to the University of California?



QUESTIONS AND GUIDANCE

- ▶ Remember, the personal questions are just that — personal. Which means you should use our guidance for each question just as a suggestion in case you need help. The important thing is expressing who are you, what matters to you and what you want to share with UC.

HOW DOES IT WORK?

- For eligible California students whose annual family income is under \$80,000, UC's systemwide tuition and fees will be fully covered during your first four years at UC (or two years if you are a transfer student) up to your financial need.
