
Dual Credit Enrollment

Move On When Ready (MOWR)

Effective July 1, 2015 (FY 2016)

- Eligibility
 - 9th 12th grade students
 - Attending an eligible and participating high school or home study program
 - Accepted for admission to an eligible and participating postsecondary institution



- Course Options
 - Students select courses from the Move On When Ready
 Course Directory available on GAcollege411.org
 - The Course Directory includes comparable required courses
 - Degree/non-degree level core courses (English, math, science, social studies, foreign language)
 - Career, technical and agricultural education courses
 - Electives

- Applying for MOWR
 - Online application (GAcollege411.org) to be completed by students attending an eligible public or private high school
 - Paper application (printed from GAcollege411.org) to be completed by home study students and students with no Social Security number
 - Application has three parts
 - Students and parents complete Part A
 - High school counselors/home study instructors complete Part B
 - Postsecondary institutions complete Part C
 - All three sections must be completed and submitted to GSFC

- Application Deadlines
 - Student, high school/home study program or parent and postsecondary institution must complete the MOWR application and submit it to GSFC by the following deadlines

Term	Application Deadline
Fall	October 1
Winter	March 1
Spring	March 1
Summer	May 15

- High schools and colleges may also have a MOWR procedure including earlier deadlines
- Students must be approved and classified as a MOWR student

Awards

- Tuition
 - Public institutions: standard undergraduate tuition rate up to 15 hours per institution
 - Private institutions: \$250 per semester hour or \$187 per quarter hour (up to 15 semester hours and 12 quarter hours per term) or standard tuition whichever is less
- Mandatory Fees
 - \$50 per term (semester or quarter)
- Books
 - \$25 per semester up to 15 hours
 - \$15 per quarter up to 12 hours
 - Students may be charged for lost/damaged books
 - Cost of the book minus MOWR book allowance or \$75 whichever is less
