General Rules

- You must take each course for the entire three weeks to receive credit.
- You cannot audit courses or bring visitors to class with you.
- You will not be allowed to take a final early.
- You must return your textbook or pay the book replacement cost if you drop the course or before you take the final.

Absence and Tardy

- You can have no more than **two absences** for a three-week session.
- Summer School will **drop** students who have additional absences.
- You will not be excused for illness, accidents, or special circumstances. In Summer School, there is no difference between an excused and an unexcused absence.
- You must attend the first and last day of each session that you are enrolled to receive credit for the class. You cannot leave early on the last day.
- If you do not attend the first day, Summer School will automatically drop you.
- If you are on the **Waiting List** and enroll after the first day, you automatically receive **one** absence.
- If you withdraw or drop a course after the second day, you will receive no credit for the course.
- You will **receive an absence** for the whole day for any of the following reasons:
 - a. Missing an entire day of school
 - b. Arriving 30 minutes late in class after class starts
 - c. Returning 30 minutes late to the class after mid-morning breaks
 - d. Leaving the campus grounds during the school day, even during break
 - e. Leaving class early for an appointment
- Summer School may also count excessive tardies as absences. You will receive a tardy for the following reasons:
 - a. Entering class after attendance is taken, even if you are only one minute late
 - b. Returning late from any breaks, including restroom breaks.

The on-site administrator, with input from the teacher, deals with excessive tardies on a case-bycase basis. Detentions will be assigned to make up the time, and Summer School may drop you if the tardies continue.

Behavior and Discipline

- Students should practice good behavior at all times. At the first class session, the instructor will provide students with information about behavior expectations.
- Students who receive a discipline referral must come to the Administration Office. The Summer School Office will notify the Parent/Guardian of the referral and the planned disciplinary action.
- Summer School will **drop** any student who receive **behavior referrals**, and will enforce Education Code 48900 related to suspension and expulsion.
- There is no distinction between summer school and regular school with respect to a school day with suspensions (AUHSD AR 5144.1 – Suspension and Expulsion / Due Process.)
