

Block Schedule

- Schedule operates on a 4 period block, A/B day format
- Most classes are 90 min. block everyday for a semester
- Some classes are 90 min. every other day all year
 - ◆ (Arts, World Languages, AP, JROTC, Journalism, some math)
 - 1st Period 8:55-10:25 3rd Period 12:05-2:05*
 - 2nd Period 10:30-12:00 4th Period 2:10-3:40

* Lunch is during 3x period.

Freshman Orientation

- Freshman <u>Student</u> Orientation will be the week before school begins typically it is the same day as Open House
 - ◆ Orientation runs from 8:55 am 3:40 pm (the length of a regular school day) with check-in beginning at 8:15 am.
 - ◆ Students can ride their regular bus to and from orientation.
 - ◆ The day includes learning strategies for success in high school, a school tour, and a schedule run
 - ◆ Freshmen will get to know upperclassmen student leaders and learn about extracurriculars.
- Freshman <u>Parent</u> Orientation is typically the Monday before the first week of school. More information will be posted on the Mount Tabor homepage and Remind.






9th Grade



10th Grade



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Driver's Education

The state of NC requires anyone under the age of 18 to complete a driver education course consisting of 30 hours in the classroom and 6 hours behind-the-wheel.

To be eligible to register for a class session, students must be 14 years and 6 months old by the first day of class.

- All driver's ed. classes are taught by North Carolina Driving School, Inc.
- Register online beginning 21 days prior to the first day of class. Registration closes out five days before each class
