# **FUTURE READY GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS**

**(For Ninth Graders Entering in 2012-2013 and Later)**

<b>English:</b>	<b>4 credits</b>
<b>Mathematics:</b>	<b>4 credits (Math 1, Math 2, Math 3) 4<sup>th</sup> Math course to be aligned with the student's post high school plans</b>
<b>Science:</b>	<b>3 credits (A physical science course, Biology, Environmental Science)</b>
<b>Social Studies:</b>	<b>4 credits (Civics and Economics, World History, American History and 1 or Turning Points in American History &amp; AP US History)</b>
<b>World Languages:</b>	<b>Not required for high school graduation. A two credit minimum is required for admission to a university in the UNC System</b>
<b>Health/PE</b>	<b>1 credit</b>

**Electives 11 credits required (2 electives of any combination from either Career Technical Education, Arts Education, World Languages) (4 electives strongly recommended from one of the following: Career and Technical Education, JROTC, Arts Education, any other subject area (e.g. social studies, science, English, mathematics))**

## Grade level is determined as follows:

Freshman:	Promoted from Grade 8
Sophomore:	Earned 6 credits
Junior:	Earned 12 credits
Senior:	Earned 19 credits

# Graduation: Latin Honor System

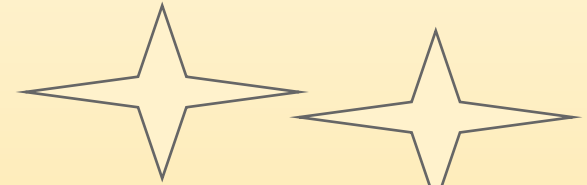


Graduates with these recognitions will wear a Latin Honors cord at graduation.

GPA of 3.5-3.99: Cum Laude (with praise)

GPA of 4.0-4.49: Magna Cum Laude (with great praise)

GPA of 4.5 or greater: Summa Cum Laude (with highest praise)



Students earning a grade of 90 to 100 receive a 4.0 GPA; Honors courses are assigned a 0.5 quality point. Advanced placement courses are assigned a 1.0 quality point. Career and College Promise (dual enrollment classes taken through Piedmont Community College and other community colleges while attending high school) will receive a 0.5 quality point.



# ***DMV Eligibility***

***North Carolina has legislation that reflects a coordinated statewide effort to motivate and encourage students to complete high school. The revocation of a student's driving permit or license will result if a student is unable to maintain adequate progress or drops out of school. The law went into effect August 1, 1998. Adequate academic progress will be evaluated at the end of each semester. A student must pass 3 out of 4 courses each semester in order to be eligible to receive a Driver's Eligibility Certificate. Students who do not meet these criteria will be reported to DMV and will have their permit or license revoked.***

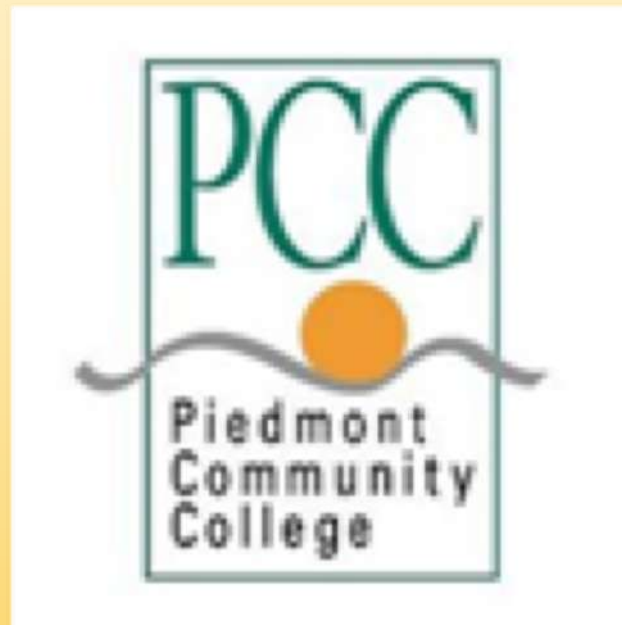
***The "Lose Control" law has been in effect since July 1, 2000. The law will suspend a student's permit or license for one year. The legislation directs public schools, community colleges, and nonpublic schools to notify the North Carolina Division of Motor Vehicles whenever a student is given an expulsion/suspension for more than 10 consecutive days or an assignment to an alternative educational setting for more than 10 consecutive days for one of the following reasons:***

- 1. The possession or sale of an alcoholic beverage or an illegal controlled substance on school property.***
- 2. The possession or use on school property of a weapon or firearm that resulted in disciplinary action under G.S. 115C-391 (dl) or that could have resulted in that disciplinary action if the conduct had occurred in a public school.***
- 3. The physical assault on a teacher or other school personnel on school property.***



### ***Career & College Promise at Piedmont Community College***

Students in Caswell County Schools may **earn tuition-free college credit** by enrolling in selected courses at Piedmont Community College (PCC). These transfer courses also provide credit toward high school graduation. Within the PCC-CTE pathway options, students may earn various career-ready certifications, including Criminal Justice, Welding, and Cosmetology.
