



"Just Right" Reading Levels



Children feel successful and enjoy reading when they read books at their independent reading levels. When a book is "just right", readers can:

- Read almost all of the words without help (>96% accuracy),
- Read in meaningful phrases with expression at an appropriate rate.
- Show their understanding of what they read by retelling the major events or information. They can answer literal comprehension questions and inferential ones that go beyond what is explicitly stated in the text. (how do you think the character felt when __? Why do you think that?)

Teachers work with students at their <u>instructional</u> level in small group lessons to help them reach goals and attain necessary skills and strategies to be ready to choose books at the next level.

The writing lab will be an opportunity for MBE teachers to have ongoing vertical conversations about MBE's writing goals and how to support students in achieving their own goals.




