FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S OFFICE:

Kindness Chain

This month's theme at T.I.S. is kindness. Our most recent HAWK's Nest lesson focussed on kindness. In our nests, we reviewed the definition of kindness as being friendly, generous, and considerate. We also discussed research that points to the fact that when we practice kindness either to other people or towards ourselves, we can experience positive mental and physical changes through lowering stress levels.

We let our students know that the T.I.S. staff have been engaged in small random acts of kindness within our school community since the start of the school year. We described our random acts of kindness as a simple way to make the community feel good, increase endorphins and create a positive and happier learning community.

Our HAWK's Nest culminated in students creating a mini paper chain which will be strung together with chains from other students resulting in one giant random acts of kindness chain. Student chains consist of a heart in which students wrote a random act of kindness they would do for someone at school.



1:1 District Chromebook Initiative

All Tolland students in grades three through eight will be provided with a district Chromebook. These district Chromebooks will be required for every student. Students will need the district Chromebooks as opposed to personally owned devices. Emails outlining the 1:1 initiative have been sent to parents/guardians of third, fourth and fifth grade students. The only costs associated with the devices are an optional insurance policy and an optional hardshell protective case.

FROM LAST WEEK'S DIGITAL BACKPACK:

GRADE LEVEL UPDATES:

GRADE 3

Third grade teachers would like to start by saying thank you for all the support at home. We know that the couple weeks at home wasn't easy for anyone and your support made it easier for us. We are happy to have in-person students back in school and have our remote learners joining us each day. T.I.S. just wasn't the same without the happy faces of our third graders.

We are making great progress in our curriculum. In the Journeys reading program we are entering Unit 4, Natural Wonders. We start off reading *Judy Moody Saves the World*, where we discuss the importance of recycling. Our next story is *The Albertosaurus Mystery: Philip Currie's Hunt in the Badlands*, where students learn about the hunt for fossils. We'll be working on comprehension skills such as drawing conclusions, point of view, story structure, and monitoring while reading.

For grammar we'll be working on adjectives that compare, word roots, the verb be, helping verbs, irregular verbs, and adverbs. We are plugging right along in Fundations, most teachers are beginning Unit 7. We are working on adding suffixes to words, marking words, and getting into more complex vocabulary.

Classes working in the Math in Focus program are beginning a unit on fractions. Students working in the Bridges math program are beginning their unit on multiplication and division. The San Francisco math program is also working on multiplication. Having students practice math facts with games or reflex is a great way to help them with their daily math skills.

We wrapped up our social studies unit that focused on Connecticut and Tolland in the 1700s. Third graders looked at pictures of the Benton Homestead and learned about what life was like on a self-sufficient farm in the 1700s. We also talked about the importance of living near the Connecticut river during this time. Next, we will begin to focus on a science unit called Odd Motions. Students will learn about forces, gravity, and do hands-on activities that focus on these concepts.

Again, thank you for all your support at home. Third grade teachers are so happy to have wonderful and supportive parents at home during these times.

GRADE 4

Fourth grade students are transitioning from division to decimals. The division unit focuses on helping students understand decimal notation for fractions and comparing decimals. We continue to use IXL and Reflex Math to strengthen our skills.

In Language Arts, we are finishing up Unit 2, "Tell Me More", which included fiction, non-fiction, and biography. We will be starting Unit 3, "Inside Nature", which focuses on non-fiction selections about understanding what's happening in the natural world around us.

We are integrating our social studies unit on the Northeast Region with informational writing instruction. Students are learning to research and write an informational piece related to the Northeast Region. Students are discovering that it's a great place to live!!

Students continue to have a positive attitude as they focus on their learning, and are doing a great job adapting.

GRADE 5

Each month TIS focuses on one positive attribute. This month we are focusing on kindness. Fifth graders are writing one compliment to each classmate. They are also encouraged to write notes to anyone else in their lives who have been kind.

Fifth grade students are working on their fraction and decimal units. They are currently focused on adding and subtracting but soon will be practicing multiplying and dividing. They will also be applying those skills to real world problems.

In language arts, students are enjoying our unit "Play on Words." They are learning the difference between literal and figurative language through literature and skits. We are reading the novel, The Phantom Tollbooth, by Norton Juster. This entertaining and engaging book is keeping our students on the edge of their seats! Ask your child to tell you about the book and the Abbott and Costello skit, "Who's on First," if they haven't told you about it already.

In Social Studies students are working on group projects to address the question "How did colonization affect the freedom and equality of various groups of people?" They are taking on the role of being Smithsonian Museum experts to create a Slide Show exhibit entitled, "English Colonization of America."






