# **Research Project Rubric**

## 6 **EXEMPLARY** (91-100)

- Student posed a clearly stated and appropriately focused research questions/thesis that involved challenging research. *(Effective Writer, Self-Directed Learner)*
- All topics are addressed and all questions answered. Information clearly relates to the main topic and includes several supporting details and/or examples. (Effective Writer)
- Student used 5+ sources, which reflect a variety of information gathering techniques. (Effective Reader)
- Sources are properly cited both in-text/in-product and on Works-Cited or Works-Consulted pages/slides. No errors in citations. (Effective Writer)
- Research Project is logically organized and there are relevant connections among ideas (Effective Writer)
- Research is expressed clearly; information from the sources was effectively interpreted and synthesized and appropriately presented to a diverse audience (*Effective Reader, Respectful Person*)
- Documentation is error-free. No grammatical, spelling or punctuation errors. Project is handed in on-time, by deadline (Effective Writer, Self Directed Learner)

#### 5 <u>COMMENDABLE (84-90)</u>

- 4 <u>GOAL (77-83)</u>
  - Student posed a focused research question involving them in challenging research. (Effective Writer, Self-Directed Learner)
  - Most topics are addressed and most questions answered. Information is relatable to the main topic and provides 1-2 supporting details and/or examples. (*Effective Writer*)
  - Student used 3-4 relevant sources only in print and electronic. (Effective Reader)
  - Sources are documented with some care, sources are cited, both in-text/in-product and on Works-Cited/Works-Consulted pages/slides. Few errors noted in citations. *(Effective Writer)*
  - Research project is organized and there are adequate connections among ideas. (Effective Writer)
  - Student communicated the results of research to the audience by validating, respecting and responding to the opinions/ideas of others. (*Effective Reader, Respectful Person*)
  - **Project has 3-5 grammatical, spelling or punctuation errors. Project is handed in on time, by deadline.** (Effective Writer, Self Directed Learner)

#### **3 <u>PROFICIENT</u> (70-76)**

#### 2 <u>SUBSTANDARD</u> (65-69)

- Student constructed a question that lends itself to readily available answers. Relied heavily on teacher support. *(Effective Writer, Self-Directed Learner)*
- Only some topics are addressed and only some questions answered. Information relates vaguely to the main topic. *(Effective Writer)*
- Student gathered information from a limited range, 1-2 sources, and displayed minimal effort in selecting quality resources. *(Effective Reader)*
- Documentation was poorly constructed. Many errors in citations. (Effective Writer)
- Research project is not organized and there are limited connections among ideas. *(Effective Writer)*
- Research project was not presented effectively; audience was engaged with little to no success. (Effective Reader, Respectful Person)
- **Project has 6-10 grammatical, spelling or punctuation errors. Project was handed in one day late.** (Effective Writer, Self Directed Learner)

### 1 NOT ACCEPTABLE (0-64)

- Student relied on teacher-generated question or developed a question requiring little creative thought. (Effective Writer, Self-Directed Learner)
- One or more topics were addressed. Information has little or nothing to do with the main topic. (Effective Writer)
- Student lacked gathering information from a verity of sources. Depended solely on personal knowledge or limited research and refused to engage in an in-depth process of gathering data from various sources. (Effective Reader)
- Student conclusions involved restating information. Conclusions were not supported by evidence nor cited. (Effective Writer)
- Student work is not logically or effectively structured. Student did not present to an audience. (Effective Writer)
- Student showed little evidence of thoughtful research. Product does not effectively communicate research findings. *(Effective Reader, Respectful Person)*
- Project has more than 10 grammatical, spelling, or punctuation errors. Project was handed in more than one day late. *(Effective Writer, Self Directed Learner)*
