Dr. Paul Tabereaux received his high school diploma from Sheffield High School in 1991. He attended the University of Alabama in Tuscaloosa receiving a BS in Biological Sciences. He then completed a Masters of Public Health in Epidemiology and medical degree from the University Alabama School of Medicine in 2001. He performed his internship and residency in Internal Medicine in New Hampshire, Connecticut. In his final year at Yale he was selected to remain on faculty as the Chief Medical Resident, aiding in the education and administration of the residency program for an additional year.

Dr. Tabereaux then returned to complete his Cardiovascular Disease Fellowship at the University of Alabama at Birmingham. He was again selected as the Chief Cardiology Fellow at the University Alabama at Birmingham. He completed his training at UAB after an additional fellowship in Cardiac Electrophysiology under the tutelage of Dr. Neal Kay allowing him to perform specialized cardiac surgery on the electrical system of the heart.

Dr. Tabereaux is now triple boarded in Internal Medicine, Cardiovascular Diseases and Cardiac Electrophysiology.

His clinical and research interests include pacemaker and defibrillator device implantation, cardiac mapping and ablation of arrhythmias including complex ablation of the atrial fibrillation and ventricular tachycardia. He practices at The Heart Center at Huntsville Hospital and remains as an adjunct faculty member for the UAB-Huntsville Campus.

Dr. Tabereaux has written and published 27 peer reviewed articles in scientific journals and 2 book chapters in the fields of cardiovascular medicine and electrophysiology.
