POLICIES & REGULATIONS

In order to provide a safe and positive school climate, all students are expected to follow these rules:

- 1. Be respectful and follow the directions of all adults at Frick Middle School. If you feel you have been treated unfairly, see an administrator at an appropriate time (<u>not during class</u>). Demonstrate the aptitude, attitude, and skills needed to lead responsible, fulfilling, and respectful lives.
- 2. No food, drinks, or gum allowed in the hallways or classrooms.
- 3. When walking in the hallway and on the stairs, all students should walk on the right side. No running or yelling in the hallways or stairs. No horseplay will be tolerated at all, especially during lunch.
- 4. No loitering is permitted after school or during a school dance.
- 5. Use lockers before school, between 8:25-8:30 a.m., before and after assigned lunch period, and after school. You may not use your lockers during passing/break time. Only use the locker assigned to you. Do not share your combination with other students.
- 6. Resolve conflicts in non-violent ways; fighting will result in suspension. Do not instigate conflicts; this will also result in suspension
- 7. No cursing, teasing, use of the "N" word, the word "faggot" or any foul or inappropriate language.
- 8. No inappropriate touching, grabbing, verbal statements, written statements, elicit drawings or sexual advances.
- 9. No dating violence, including the intentional use of physical, sexual, verbal, emotional or technological abuse by a person to harm, threaten, intimidate or control another person in a relationship of a romantic or intimate nature, regardless of whether that relationship is continuing or has concluded or the number of interactions between the individuals involved.

10. Dress Code:

- a. Hats, scarves, wave caps, or any other kind of headgear, sunglasses, or gloves are not allowed indoors. No plain black "hoodies". No white t-shirts.
- b. Gold teeth or "grills", sagging pants, obscene or inappropriate t-shirts, gang colors or jewelry that advocate gang participation, short shorts, short skirts, translucent clothing, tight clothing, underwear worn as outerwear, baremidriff or cut-off shirts are forbidden.
- c. No cuts or slits in pants are allowed.
- d. Pajamas are not considered acceptable attire and are not permitted.
- e. Shoes or sandals must be worn at all times. House shoes are not allowed.
 - A student who is dressed inappropriately will be asked to return home to dress in acceptable school attire.
 - A student who continues to dress inappropriately will be subject to suspension.

11. Electronic Devices:

a. Use of electronic devices is not permitted during school hours. These items include, but are not limited to, cellular phones, MP3 players, electronic games, radios, CD players, etc.

- b. If an electronic device is brought to school, it is done at the risk of the owner. Frick Middle School will not assume responsibility for such items and will not replace any lost or stolen electronic device.
- c. If a student violates this rule, the device(s) will be confiscated and <u>will be returned at</u> the discretion of the teacher/administrator.
- d. If a student violates this rule and the violation involves behavior that can be classified as dating violence, the device(s) will be confiscated and the teacher/administrator will contact the student's parent/caregiver to inform them of the violation. The device will be returned at the discretion of the teacher/administrator.
- e. The headphones or earpiece to an electronic device should not be visible.

12. Bicycles:

- a. Students may bring bicycles to school. All bicycles must be parked in the stalls in front of the breezeway and secured with a personal lock. No bicycles will be stored in any offices.
- b. You must not ride your bicycle on the school grounds.
- c. Bicycles are not to be accessed during the school day unless the student is being sent home early.
- d. If a bicycle is brought to school, it is done at the risk of the owner. Frick Middle School will not assume responsibility for such items and will not replace any lost or stolen bicycles.
- 13. Follow the rules as set in each of your classrooms.

Failure to follow school and district rules can result in disciplinary action that might include detention, suspension, or referral to the school district for expulsion.

DISCIPLINE PROCESS

Student expectations around behavior are high. We expect students to abide by school site and classroom rules while on campus. Students will face consequences for minor and major infractions.

Minor Infractions Examples:

- Failure to bring required materials
- Failure to follow directions the first time they are given
- Disruptive (inappropriately loud)
- Profanity (cursing)
- Out of seat without permission
- Throwing objects
- Not on task
- Put-downs or teasing
- Eating or drinking
- Refusal to take off hat or hood

Progressive Discipline for Minor Infractions:

- Warning
- Student-Teacher Conference
- Call home
- Detention
- Referral to Administrator
 - Any student sent out on referral will NOT be allowed back into classroom until an administrator clears the referral.

Major Infraction Examples:

- Physical Fighting
- Bullying, Threatening, Harassment
- Under the Influence of drugs or alcohol
- Drug possession
- Weapon Possession
- Stealing
- Threats / Assault toward staff
- Extreme disrespect toward staff
- Failure to give over cell phone
- Refusal to complete work

Discipline for Major Infractions:

 Students who commit a major infraction will be referred to an administrator immediately

ATTENDANCE

Daily attendance is expected. When your student is absent in middle school you must to provide them with a parent note. The attendance note should have the today's date, student's name, the dates of the absence(s), why your student was absent, parent/guardian name and phone number. You can write the note in English or Spanish.

Here is an example:

September 26, 2015

To Whom It May Concern:

Please excuse Stacey Jones from school yesterday Monday, September 25, 2015. She had a dentist appointment.

Thank you.

Rebecca Jones 729-7736

All attendance notes are brought to the attendance office the first day a student returns, they will give your student a pink slip to give to their teachers. Students give the pink slip to their teachers at the beginning of each class for them to sign and then ask for it back once they sign it. At the end of the day students turn it in back in to the attendance office.

Remember a note is required for EVERY absence. If a student has three or more absences that are unexcused (meaning that we didn't receive a note) then the school district will send a truancy letter to your home and you could later have to meet with a school site representative. Students with five or more unexcused absences are habitually truant.

If your student must leave early please provide them with a note that gives the same information as above along with the time that they must leave. They need to bring this note to the attendance office in the morning when they arrive at school in order to get a permit to leave for the appropriate time. Your student will then wait for you in the attendance office unless otherwise indicated.

PROMOTION REQUIREMENTS

Students eligible to be promoted to the next grade level at the end of the year have met the following academic standards:

- 2.00 Academic GPA as well as a 2.00 Total GPA.
 - Final promotion eligibility is calculated by averaging the Semester 1 and Semester 2 GPAs for both academic and total GPA.
- Completion of 8th grade project.

Being able to participate in the promotion ceremony is a privilege and not a right, and all students participate at the discretion of school site administration. Students must wear only a white top (shirt or blouse) and black bottoms (pants or skirt) to the promotion ceremony.

STUDENT SERVICES

Frick Middle School offers a host of programs and services aimed at supported the needs of students to remove barriers to their academic and general success. All services are free of charge:

Academic Support:

- We have a thriving extended day school program that provides both academic and enrichment programming daily until 6:00 PM.
- Americorps volunteers provide school day and after school support to students in need addition support in ELA and/or math.

Behavioral Health:

- The East Bay Agency for Children (EBAC) has partnered with Frick Middle School to provide 2 fulltime mental health therapist providing therapy to students here on site. These therapists diligently work to support students in creating plans for overcoming what they are struggling with so that they can reach their personal and academic goals.
- ASPIRE provides drug & alcohol therapy for students who may be users themselves or who
 may be dealing with the negative affects of drug and alcohol use from a family member.

Physical Health:

• The Frick Health Center works to increase well-being and to create positive community change through connecting students, staff, and families to high-quality, culturally competent, and supportive youth development, mental health, medical, and dental services. All services through the health center are free of charge and confidential, please call (510) 639-3507 for an appointment. The Frick School Based Health Center is run by the East Bay Agency for Children in partnership with Native American Health Center, Alameda County Health Care Services, and Oakland Unified School District.
