Course Description:

Major Instructional Goals: Early American History, with a focus on the American Revolution through Reconstruction.

Students will:

- Read nonfiction materials to acquire new information and to build an understanding of the world. With this information students will be able to conduct an informed discussion and argue a position with supported data.
- Use geographic tools to analyze patterns in human and physical systems. Interpret maps and other geographic tools as a primary source to analyze a historic issue.
- Analyze causes and effects of major conflicts from the origins of the American Revolution through Reconstruction
- Formulate appropriate hypotheses about United States history based on a variety of historical sources and perspectives. Use and interpret primary and secondary sources.
- Analyze elements of continuity and change in the United States government and the role of
 citizens over time. Analyze primary sources supporting democratic freedoms and the
 founding of our government. Documents to include but not limited to the Declaration of
 Independence, Constitution, Bill of Rights, and explain how they provide for both continuity
 and change.
- Research and organize information from a variety of sources to be presented in a logical, organized format.
- Write using proper grammar and mechanics throughout the year.
