Class Offerings

Abstract Art: Explore and understand the relationship of line, shape and color as they relate to abstract art. Learn about Jackson Pollack, Paul Klee and Pablo Picasso and create unique works of art using abstract painting techniques in watercolor, acrylic and tempera paint. We will also attempt a simple 3D sculpture. No pressure just controlled chaos of art materials and tons of fun. **K-2 & 3-6**

All-Star Sports: Each day a new sport and activity to enhance skills, cooperation, teamwork, and strategy building while having a great time with friends. Class will be broken down by developmental level if necessary. **K-6**

Animal Planet: Students will explore and create different animals and habitats each day. A variety of multimedia, books, and arts and crafts will be used to discover new creatures. **K-3**

Babysitting: Learn all the basics to keep a young child safe including feeding, first aide, and life saving techniques. **Will not lead to certification. 4-6**

Book Cooks: Reading and recipes for the little ones. What fun! Students read and are read to, then make fun food and learn to “cook.” **K-2**

Bringing Books to Life: Read some of your favorite stories and then roll up your sleeves to do crafts and projects related to the book. **K-2**

Cheerleading: This is an exciting class that requires a lot of energy, spirit and concentration. Learn steps, moves, and simple stunts. Beginner and Intermediate levels (must have knowledge of arm movements and jumps). Open to boys and girls. **K-6**

Circus: Come join the party under the big top! Learn how to juggle, try spinning plates, and more in this fun-filled class. **3-6**

Clay & Sculpture: Each student will produce a finished glazed clay piece along with several other interesting projects using model magic, air dry clay, and sculpture. A variety of sculpting methods will be used including plaster, wire and fabric for students to express themselves in a 3-dimensional environment. **K-2 & 3-6**

Community Helpers: Each day we explore a different community helper such as policemen, firemen, and trash collectors, and more. Expect to meet many of these community helpers who protect us every day. **K-3**

Computer Coding (Beginner): This fun and exciting class teaches beginning computer coding and challenges students with technology. **K-2 & 3-6**

Computer Coding (Intermediate): Want to learn how video games are created? This is the class for you! Learn how to use computer coding to create video games. **3-6**

Crime Lab Investigation: Decode fingerprints, examine soil, and analyze ink composition. It’s up to you to use the clues to solve the crime. **3-6**

Diamond Sports: Enjoy the fun and excitement of diamond sports such as tee-ball, 3-ball, powerball, and kickball, all while making new friends and getting exercise. **K-6**

Class Offerings

Flag Football 101: Learn the basics and fundamentals of football including stance, start, receiving, quarter backing, and more. **3-6**

Fun with Fido: Learn how to meet new dogs, make treats, toys and groom our furry friends. Our instructor has her trained Dog Star Rescue pups ready to make this class exciting for all. **2-6**

Games From Around the World: Learn about and play a variety of games: card, board, and physical games (non-contact) from different countries. You will even make your own Mancal game to take home at the end of the week. **K-2 & 3-5**

Getting Ready for Kindergarten: This is a great class for your child to work on writing, coloring, socializing, and listening skills to prepare them for the upcoming school year. **K**

Hip Hop Dance: Learn some of today's latest steps and moves in this fast-paced fun class. Dress comfortably and wear sneakers or your dance shoes. Open to boys and girls. **K-6**

Introduction to Guitar: Learn the basic finger placement and chords to play guitar in this exciting class. **Guitars available to borrow. 4-6**

Lego Land: The LEGO education construction set is an easy-to-use program that introduces young students to robotics. Children build LEGO models featuring working motors and sensors. **K-2 & 3-6**

MasterChef: Learn the proper safety and necessary measuring and use of fractions in this fun-filled class. Students will be able to make a variety of baked goods and learn the skills to be clean and safe. **3-6**

Minecraft: Explore the creative side of the game by making new worlds and completing challenges with your new friends. **K-2 & 3-6**

Mission Impossible: Students will need to be creative and use problem-solving to conquer escape-type activities. Come ready to be challenged! **3-6**

Music Makers: Explore music and how to make your own instruments out of everyday items. See how creative you and your new friends can be. **K-2**

Oceanography: Explore the seven seas in a variety ways that include reading, multimedia, and a variety of arts and crafts projects. **K-2**

Outer Space Science: Explore and create planets, moons, solar systems and more in this exciting class that explores a new world. **2-6**

Printmaking: Make colorful and interesting small scale works of art (prints) using a variety of different art techniques. Artists will make both single color and multicolor prints from foam plates, gelatin plates, wood blocks and cardboard sheets. **3-6**

Recycle Art: Children will recycle every day household items and create beautiful works of art. **3-6**

Scrapbooking: Gather your best photos to create your very own scrapbook, stickers and colorful backgrounds will enhance the value of your memories. **3-6**

Sloppy Scientists: Students will enjoy getting messy with this class. Children will explore science by making many fun projects that include gak, oobleck, and playdough! **K-2 & 3-6**

Soccer Skills: Enhance your soccer skills and game-playing while making new friends and having a blast! **K-6**

Stem Art: Einstein meets Van Gogh. Students will combine concepts of science, technology, engineering and math into stunning works of art. Combine LEDs with watercolor, create 3-D art and draw with a robotic pen. **3-6**
