Mrs. White -

Students are working on improving their close reading skills to promote reading comprehension. We're also working on improving silent reading fluency. Our class as a whole has an average reading level gain of 0.5. This means students can read half of a grade level higher now than they could at the beginning of the school year!

Miss Kozera -

Students are working on a data based reading program in reading resource. The focus is on comprehension, vocabulary, and visual skills. In math, we are completing a project on the steps of multiplying mixed numbers.

Reminders:

- Remember to check INOW for information for your student. If you have not already, check your child's progress report now.
- No cell phones are to be in the sixth grade building. If you feel it is necessary for your student to have a cell phone, it should be powered off, and in their bookbag throughout the school day.
- No physical contact is allowed on campus. "Intentional touching/striking" is not tolerated.
- Leggings, jeggings, and tights are not allowed. If they are worn, a tunic or dress
 must be over them and must be long enough to extend beyond the student's
 fingertips. If a student receives a dress code violation, a student cannot remain
 in nor return to class until appropriate attire can be provided by parents.
- Teachers assign After School Detention (ASD) for discipline infractions. ASD is held on Tuesdays each week from 3:00 – 4:00. Failure to attend assigned ASD results in mandatory attendance in Saturday School. Our next Saturday School is September 28.
- Friday, October 11th and Monday, October 14th are Instructional Planning and Data Assessment Days for Teachers. Students do not have classes on these days.
