Preparing for High School is a very exciting time and there are several important dates to note!

*On **February 3**, a video will be available for incoming 9th grade families to view. It will include clips from NHS teachers, athletics, counselors, and more! The video will be available at 7pm and can be viewed here.

*On **February 11** the NHS HAWKS Honors Society students will be virtually attending all 8th grade classes! The HAWKS students will speak about life at NHS, electives, sports, and clubs, as well as answer students' questions. This Q&A will be a live virtual session held during school hours.

*On **February 17**, students and parents will be able to log into PowerSchool's parent portal to view recommendations for 9th grade courses. 8th grade cluster and world language teachers' recommendations are based on a rubric that is provided by NHS. Criteria for 9th Grade Academic Course Recommendations

English Courses

All incoming freshmen will be recommended for College Prep English I unless they meet the following criteria. Students with an average of 95 or above in 8th grade English who have demonstrated they are avid readers and are self-directed, self-motivated, independent thinkers who consistently complete homework (at least 95% of the time), who have consistently scored at or above the 85s percentile on the NVEA Reading assessment, and who demonstrate skilled writing ability across multiple genres will be recommended for Honors English I.

Students interested in enrolling in Journalism in 9th grade must meet the criteria for Honors English I listed above and must seek a recommendation from their 8th grade Language Arts teacher by February 26, 2018. A successful Journalism student possesses strong writing skills, strong interpersonal skills, and an ability to meet deadlines 100 percent of the time. The course relies on these traits to produce a monthly edition of The Hawkeye, the NHS school newspaper. Furthermore, the course requires students work as part of a team to complete tasks.

*Starting March 1, the NHS school counselors will meet <u>virtually</u> with all middle school students to begin creating their schedules for next year. All students will have their own individual 10 minute pre-scheduled appointment. Students should prepare by reviewing the online program of studies and selecting 5 electives they would like to take. Prior to March 1, school counselors will go to 8th grade learning labs to answer students' questions about the transition and help them prepare for the high school meetings.
