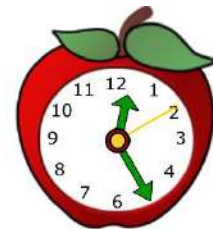

To pick up students at the end of the day, please utilize the drop off/pick up lane and wait for your student to be released to you. Teachers have an assigned pick up area with their students and will release students to parents. You may also park your car and meet your student on the sidewalk area around the drop off/pick up lane.

Breakfast begins at 8:25 (please do not drop off your students early). Students will be released from the cafeteria to go to their classroom at 8:45. If your student will not be eating breakfast, please do not drop off earlier than 8:45 (there is no playground time before school). Students arriving later than 8:55 will be considered tardy and need to come to the front office to get signed into school.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS

PARKING AND PICK-UP

Please help us maintain a nice traffic flow by remembering and adhering to the following procedures:

- Stay with your car if you stop along the curb. The curb in front and to the west of the building is for PICK UP / DROP OFF ONLY.
- **If you are going into the building, even briefly, please park in a parking space.**
- **Always pull as far forward as possible to the West**, when picking up or dropping off. This keeps the line from backing up into the highway. Also, please do not cut into the moving lane- just join at the end and continue to move forward.
- If you are parked out in the lot, away from the curb, please get out of your car, walk and meet your child at the curb.



For safety reasons, children are instructed to remain on the sidewalk until escorted by an adult.

- Park on the East side of Village Way to avoid the parking lot congestion. Students will be exiting through the gap in the fence. Please do NOT wave kids across the street without an adult beside them.
- The parking lot on the north side of the building (behind the Preschool building) is for STAFF and Preschool parking only. Please do not drop off or pick up your K-5 students in that lot because there is no safety supervision.

Please remember EACH DAY to fill out the CoVid Symptom Tracker for your student.

To ensure an environment in which our children can focus we request that the following items be left at home: MP3 players, electronic games, trading cards, roller blades, hee-ies, skateboards, toys, and laser pens.

Students are expected to arrive to class on time. When a child is late to school he/she misses out on important information and interrupts the classroom instruction. Our tardy bell rings at 8:55 a.m. If your child arrives late, students need to come into the front lobby to get a tardy pass.

NEWS FROM THE COUNSELOR

It is wonderful to be back in school with our students! I have been getting to know students who are new to Broadway (grades 1-5) in my new student groups. These groups help support students in making new friends and learning more about our school. I am also doing classroom lessons this month about resiliency. Students are learning about action steps to help build resiliency during challenging times.

Here is a reminder about the services that I provide at Broadway:

- Whole class lessons – to promote and teach skills for social and emotional learning. My lessons are in alignment with the components of the D51 Social and Emotional Learning Framework and ASCA (American School Counselor Association) standards.
- Small groups – please see my Counselor page on the school website under “Office” for a list of the small groups that I offer at school. If you are interested in having your child participate in one of my small groups, please inform your child’s classroom teacher.
- Individually counseling – Students can request to see me if they are having a problem at school. I can see students a few times individually for school related concerns. I will notify parents if the concern is serious enough to warrant notification, or if a student requests to see me more than a few times. If a student needs long term, individual counseling, I can send home a list of community counselors in our area.

Please let me know if you have questions about my counseling services at school, or if you have concerns about your child that I might be able to help with.

INTRODUCTION TO GIFTED AND TALENTED

Ever notice a child who seems to go above and beyond? Parents, teachers, and students can refer a child to be identified as gifted and talented. The student will be given a cognitive ability test. Students who test high on CogAT tests need extra support to dive deeper into their learning.

That's where I come in. I am the Gifted and Talented teacher. I teach a class called enrichment. The district has a curriculum for each grade. Students are challenged to solve puzzles and think creatively.



Kinder- Convergent vs Divergent thinking. Visual & Evaluative thinking.

1st- More of the above, plus role-playing detectives, scientists, and inventors.

2nd- More of the above with a big emphasis on analogies, which prepares us to take the CogAT test in October/November.

3rd- Deductive thinking to solve complex problems. Being autonomous learners, doing our own research and investigations.

4th- Learning to serve our community. Studying different cultures of family, school, city, country.

5th- Choosing self-driven projects at the edge of our competence. Being productive, flexible, and original.
