The Community

Griswold, which includes the Borough of Jewett City, is a rural community located in Eastern Connecticut. In addition to educating Griswold Students, the High School is a tuition school to the bordering towns of Canterbury, Lisbon, Norwich, Preston, Sprague, and Voluntown. With power from the Quinebaug and Pachaug rivers, Jewett City was once a prosperous mill town. Today, the gaming, tourism & manufacturing industries provide job opportunities.

The School

Griswold High School is a four-year comprehensive high school which offers a variety of curricular & co-curricular programs. Accredited through the New England Association of Schools and Colleges, Griswold offers six Career Pathways that provide college and career preparation for all students. In addition to a rigorous academic program, there are numerous other student-centered athletic, artistic and leadership opportunities. During the 2021/2022 school year, there are 535 students enrolled. In the 2020/2021 school year, 42% of students received free or reduced lunch.

The Faculty

Griswold High School has a total of 55 academic faculty, 3 school counselors, a reading specialist, a library media specialist, an English language learner assistant, an academic academy coordinator, a school psychologist, and a school social worker.

Partnerships & Special Programs:

- College Career Pathways (CCP) is an option available for concurrent credit with Three Rivers Community College or Quinebaug Valley Community College to earn College Credits.
- A Manufacturing Program was started in 2020 in collaboration with the Manufacturing Pipeline Initiative
- Early College Experience (ECE) offers the opportunity for concurrent credit with the University of Connecticut for English, Biology, Introduction to Individual & Family Development, and Physics
- Virtual High School (VHS) or PLATO are available to earn credit via on-line courses.
- Advanced Placement Examinations
 - *AP Exams are offered in English Language, English Literature, Calculus AB & BC, Statistics, Psychology, Biology, Computer Science, US History, American Government and Politics & VHS AP Courses*
 - *Total number of tests given in 2021: 66*

The Spring assessment of the SAT for the class of 2021 as the CT State Assessment in Reading and Math was unable to be held in March 2020 due to COVID. Unfortunately, the fall dates provided by the College Board for SAT School day did not align with our “in person” days for Seniors. The Class of 2021 was given the opportunity to take a Saturday SAT but it should be noted that most of the area schools canceled many test administrations due to safety concerns so the opportunity for seniors in the Class of 2021 to take the SAT was limited. Therefore the class of 2021 data has not been included due to a very low sample size.

Temporary Changes Due to COVID:

During Spring 2020, the quarter 3 grading period was shortened by several weeks and all students received pass with distinction (averaged as 95), pass (averaged as an 85) or fail grades (averaged as a 64) for the 4th quarter. For the 2020/2021 school year, all students were placed into cohort groups based on overall class level recommendations with most cohorts running on a 4 x 4 block schedule. For Advanced students taking AP courses, these courses ran for the entire year on an A/B Schedule. For safety reasons, students were not given choices in their courses so that they could remain with the same cohort group throughout the school day. Most traditional electives were not offered and many courses were modified to be better facilitated in a hybrid model or in a fully on-line environment when needed. Griswold High School started the school year in a hybrid model with 2 in person days and 3 distance learning days. Students/parents were also able to opt for a full distance learning model. Griswold High School is transitioning back to a full in-person, A/B Block Schedule for the 2021/22 school year.

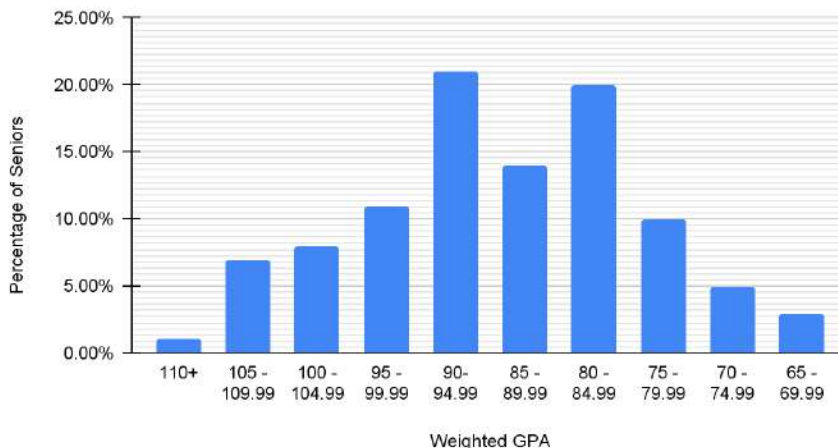
