Dear Parent/Guardian,

This year we will conduct a 5th grade Health and Hygiene class with all 5th grade classrooms. Each fifth grade class will participate in a one hour lesson between March 21 and April 1. The class will consist of a general discussion on overall body health, and will NOT be a focused growth and development class. The presentation will be given by our school nurse, Paula Feyerharm, RN.

Highlights of the class will be proper oral care, hand hygiene to reduce the spread of germs, cleaning the body and wearing clean clothes to reduce offensive body odors, and healthy eating and sleeping habits to work on a healthy body and mind. Students will have a chance to do an interactive hand washing activity during this presentation and they will come home with a small bag of hygiene products for their teeth and hands.

If you do not feel your child should participate in this presentation with their class, please sign and return the form below no later than MARCH 23.

This health and hygiene presentation is not the same as a growth and development section which is part of their health curriculum; and this health and hygiene section will **not** address stages,or changes of puberty.

The Tolland Intermediate School Nurses would like to notify you of upcoming scoliosis and postural abnormality screening for our 5th grade female students. Section 10-214 of the Connecticut General Statutes specifies that postural screening be completed for (1) each female student in grades five and seven, and (2) each male student in grade eight or nine.

"Scoliosis is a condition that causes the bones of the spine to twist or rotate so that instead of a straight line down the middle of the back, the spine looks more like the letter "C" or "S." Scoliosis curves most commonly occur in the upper and middle back (thoracic spine). They can also develop in the lower back, and occasionally, will occur in both the upper and lower parts of the spine. There are several different types of scoliosis that affect children and adolescents. Scoliosis is rarely painful—small curves often go unnoticed by children and their parents, and are first detected during a school screening or at a regular check-up with the pediatrician" (The Pediatric Orthopaedic Society of North America and the Scoliosis Research Society, 2015).

The purpose of the screening is to detect early signs of postural abnormalities so that a referral can be made to initiate treatment to prevent, if possible, the discomfort and complications that can arise from these abnormalities, and ,if possible, prevent the need for future surgery.

Screening will be conducted privately, and will only take a few minutes. The screening requires we examine the students' back; therefore girls are encouraged to wear a bra, camisole, or a bathing suit top with thin strap. If this is not an item worn daily, please encourage your daughter to keep one in her bag to wear for her comfort the day of the screening.

WHAT'S HAPPENING OUT OUR CLASSROOMS:

GRADE 3

Third grade teachers and students are plugging right along in our third-grade curriculum. In Fundations most classes are working on Unit 9 and 10, which focus on the -le syllable, r-controlled syllable, adding suffixes, and many sound-alike words. In our Journeys Reading Program students are reading non-fiction texts about finding fossils, trees, and life in Antarctica. We are focusing on text features, story structure and making inferences. Our grammar focuses are the verb "Be", adverbs and comparing nouns. Please continue to read each night with your child, you can read together, or they can read independently.

Third-grade teachers have been instructing students about time, graphing, multiplication, and fractions in the Bridges Program. Students love Workplaces! These instructional games reinforce math skills. The best way to support learning is to have students practice their math facts at home. You can have them work on Reflex or play math games such as Reject, War, Circles and Stars, and any other fun activity that reinforces math facts. Flash cards or just practicing in the car on the way to sports, events, or even on the way to Big Y can make a big difference!

In science we are working on a unit called "Odd Motion". We are learning about the unseen forces of gravity, magnetism, static electricity and other concepts in physics. Students have done experiments involving moving matchbox cars, and some classes have even made magnetic slime. Third graders are very excited about these hands-on activities. We'll be moving on to a unit on fossils and then transitioning back to social studies this spring.

Mark your calendars for our two very important upcoming social studies events. Tolland Green Day will be on May 19th. Students will engage in activities that will take them back to the 1800s. We'll be visiting the Hicks Stearns Museum, the Jail Museum, a model of a One Room Schoolhouse, and playing colonial games. Teachers will be sending home information about the colonial dress that is expected for the day. To wrap up our social studies unit we will be venturing to Old Sturbridge Village on June 17th. Right now parent chaperones are allowed to join us. We will provide additional details about these activities closer to the event date.

GRADE 4

Spring is finally here and we are excited about the warmer days to come.

Our next writing unit will focus on opinion writing. The students will have the opportunity to voice their opinion on topics that are important to them. Unit 3 Reading selections, which are focused on nature, are designed to help students understand various text structures.

We celebrated Pi Day on March 14th! The students enjoyed fun activities while they learned about radius, diameter and circumference. The next area of study in math involves angles, parallel lines, perpendicular lines, and polygons.

In science, we are studying wave energy, and what can be done to help protect the shoreline from wave erosion. Students are learning about how waves form and what makes waves gain more energy, thereby becoming more destructive. In addition, we are busy planning an exciting educational field trip so our students can further explore curriculum related topics. Stay tuned for more information!!

GRADE 5

It has been an exciting month in 5th grade! Fifth Graders have been working hard on their monthly genre book reports. So far, we have covered realistic fiction, mystery, historical fiction, fantasy, graphic novel, biography and we are completing a science fiction text for the month of March. What has been your child's favorite so far?

In ELA, students finished reading "The Phantom Tollbooth," by Norton Juster. This entertaining book used literal and figurative language for a play on words. Students started our last module for fifth grade, "Breaking Barriers." In this module students will read the text, "We Are the Ship," by Kadir Nelson. Students will learn how sports affect how people view each other, to create opportunities for people, and to help people overcome and challenge barriers. Students will read and research a variety of informational texts about individual athletes, coaches, teams, and organizations to answer the question: How can sports influence individuals and societies?

In Social Studies, students just finished comparing and contrasting the three regions of the English colonies (New England, Middle, Southern) during the 1600s. They are also practicing their skills using IXL that connects to this unit. Students are excited to start Unit 3: The French and Indian War and American Revolution.

In Math, students are wrapping up their learning on multiplying and dividing whole numbers and decimals. Students learned ratio tables, partial product, area model, standard algorithm and many other strategies! They learned new workplace games such as beat the calculator, estimate and check, lowest remainder wins, and multiplication battle. We also recently celebrated Pi day! 5th graders measured circumference and diameter of circular objects and then worked to find the relation between them. We are now moving in to our next unit on multiplying and dividing fractions.

In Science, we wrapped up our ecosystems unit by learning about the human impact we have on various ecosystems. Students' final assessment was to make a new home for the Golden Jellyfish and explain all the needs for the ecosystem to survive and thrive. We are now moving into our next unit on water phenomena. Students will be following photographer Brooke Riverton around the world to learn more about water features and why they occur.

FROM LAST WEEK'S DIGITAL BACKPACK

FROM OUR MATH INTERVENTION DEPARTMENT

Mr. McCarthy and Miss Bostiga have been super busy this past week thanks to the most important holiday of the year, Pi Day! We spent the day learning about pi and completing fun activities related to the special day! Students also learned about circumference, diameter, and radius thanks to the amazing storybook, *Sir Cumference and the First Round Table* by Cindy Neuschwander. We had fun creating pi skyline pictures & pi bracelets. Fifth graders practiced measuring circular objects around the room to study the relationship between diameter and circumference, and how pi ties into the equation. Overall, it was a fun day celebrating math!

Meanwhile in Math Intervention, students have been polishing their skills in various areas.

The third graders have been working hard to master subtraction with regrouping! Students have loved using the virtual base 10 pieces to help them visualize the actual regrouping, and gain a deeper understanding of what is mathematically occurring when they borrow from a place value. Count down 1,000 has been a fun game that helps students practice their subtraction with regrouping, and the teacher vs. student matches have gotten pretty intense!

Fourth and fifth graders are working on multi-digit multiplication using area models and partial products. There have been quite a few VERY competitive games of Double Digit Splat and Capture the Multiples. We're pretty sure there are some rigged spinners or dice that students are using to claim victory over the teachers, but the jury is still out on that. Overall, students are doing a fabulous job of learning the importance and process of the distributive property of multiplication to help them multiply more complex numbers.

More Reading Ideas from the T.I.S. Reading Department

Why you should explore graphic novels ...



The combination of pictures and text inspires a love of reading and books.

The balance of text and pictures eases kids into building stamina for sustained reading. This also allows kids who have been turned off to books to finish a whole book!

Graphic novels help to build comprehension and critical thinking skills.

The pictures combined with more advanced vocabulary allow young readers to immediately find out what's happening in the book and graphic novels have more complex storylines than picture books.

The art helps to tell the story and build inference.

Engaging artwork creates a bridge to inference for characters' emotions (they can read the facial expressions) and drawings take the place of long descriptive passages keeping young readers engaged longer.

Graphic novels can provide a great family bonding opportunity.

You and your child can assume the role of a character and take turns reading the parts and discussing the meaning being conveyed in the pictures. Talk about a good time!

Graphic novels inspire creativity and writing.

The fast pace and plot centered action keep the attention of energetic young readers and

inspire them to try writing and drawing their own graphic novels.



Ms. Ballard - Art

Grade 3: IT'S CLAY TIME! Our third graders will be doing a clay project during the next month. The students will try to make a container using the coiling method of construction. They will select a base shape and then build up the sides of the container with clay coils. This project will take from the end of March to the end of April. Smocks will be needed. After building our clay containers we will be firing and glazing them.

Grade 4: Did someone say TOYS! The fourth graders will become **Toy designers** in the months of March and April. We will be starting on a "**Block of Nine**" puzzle. We will be working on **planned or random patterns** on the puzzle designs. Students will decide on their patterns and images. The puzzles will be colored in with marker or colored pencils.

Grade 5: The fifth graders will be working on two projects during the months of March & April. The first project is a **Hand Warming Sculpture** and the second project is a **Tessellation.**

A **Hand Warming Sculpture** is a **plaster casting** of the students hands. More like the negative space of the student's hands. After the casting is done the sculpture will dry and then students will paint them with Acrylic paint. Smocks will be needed for this project. **A plastic plastic bowl is needed for this project.** Students are asked to bring in a plastic bowl from home that **can be tossed out after use**. Maybe, an old cookie plastic tub or a used cool whip bowl.

While we are waiting for everyone to get their casting done we will be doing a **Tessellation** Drawing with colored pencil. A **Tessellation** is a design with no gaps or overlapping images. The artist we will be inspired by is **M.C.Escher. We hope to finish both projects by the end of April.**

** Attention Parents: Your child might be missing items from their art bags. Each student was given pencils, crayons, markers, short 6''rulers, a glue stick and a black sharpie in their art bag at the start of the school year. As the students use these items at home, in their homerooms, and in the art room these materials are lost or used up. Please, take the time with your child to find or replace these items in the art bags. Thank you for your help! Ms. Ballard

Mrs. Hill - Library Media

Grade 3: During the month of March third graders will be exploring **Folk and Fairy Tales!** They will listen/watch a tale, write notes about important characteristics like characters, setting, and magical elements, then draw a picture on the back of their favorite, or an important, part of the story. Their pages will be collected and eventually collated into individual "books" the students can take home. They will write about one tale each week and watch a second tale that will just be discussed. The students are very excited to talk about their opinions of the characters and their actions in these traditional



folk and fairy tales!

Grade 4 In March, fourth grade students will be learning about Digital Citizenship using lesson plans compiled by Common Sense Media. This award-winning company is dedicated to keeping students safe online. Topics will include what information is considered private, how to recognize "just right for you" websites, what is a digital footprint and much more! Lessons will be reinforced with a few learning games. Eventually, students will use safe, student-oriented search engines to do some basic searching and understand the difference between a website and an advertisement.





Grade 5 During the month of March, fifth grade students are working on an **Ecosystems research project**. Students chose which ecosystem they were most interested in and

began to take notes from websites Mrs. Hill provided. They also practiced taking notes from nonfiction books on their topic. Fifth graders are taking these notes and creating a Google Slide presentation. They are making individual choices on the "look" of the slideshow with input from Mrs. Hill. By the end of the month or beginning of April, fifth graders will present their slideshow to their classmates. They become the teacher and each student learns about many different aspects of ten different ecosystems.

**THE LIBRARY IS ALWAYS "OPEN"! Your student is encouraged to <u>put</u> books on hold at school or at home and the library staff will deliver the books

to their classroom! So easy!



Ms. Baker - General Music

<u>Grade 3 general music:</u> The third graders are currently practicing their music knowledge and skills through interactive station work. Coming up in the month of April, they will be learning about the instruments of the band and orchestra in preparation for choosing a musical instrument for the fourth grade band in September. Students are encouraged to participate in <u>both</u> chorus and band in fourth grade. Also, the students will be doing a creative music poetry activity in coordination with Mrs. Hill's Poetry Month.



Grade 4 general music: In the fourth grade general music classes the students are completing their unit on African music by learning and practicing their hand drumming skills. They will be reviewing the skills and knowledge they learned during the African unit through cooperative stations. In April, they will be learning about the music of Asia and Chinese music notation. We will also be discussing opportunities for next year in grade 5 band and chorus. Students will be encouraged to participate in both grade 5 band and chorus next. Both groups are a great opportunity to expand their musical abilities and have fun!

Grade 5 general music: The fifth graders are completing their unit on Hawaiian music with a cooperative composing and performing project. During the month of April, they will be practicing their ukulele chord progressions and songs to record for a digital composing project. The ukulele is a great instrument for students to learn to play. I am excited that so many students have taken the initiative to purchase their own ukuleles and continue using what they have learned at home.



Mrs. Marchesani - Band and Chorus

Grade 4 and 5 Chorus: Chorus members are refining their performance skills and preparing for their April 7th Concert to be held at TIS at 6:45 p.m. in the gymnasium. They are <u>very</u> excited to be having an in-person performance this year! Choruses will continue to meet weekly after the Concert through June. SESSIONS: 7 one week sessions; Monday-Friday, beginning Monday, June 27, 2022 and ends on Friday, August 12, 2022.

SCHEDULE: 8:00am - 4:00pm. Campers should arrive at Camp no later than 8:40am and be picked up no later than 4:00pm. Please Note: A late fee of \$10 per child per day will be assessed for any child not picked up at 4:00 pm and who is not registered in the Extended Hours Camp Program.

Dear Families.

It is a pleasure to have you join us at the Tolland Family Resource Center School Age Care Program (TFRC-SAC). The FRC staff members are CPR and first aid trained as well as medication certified. The program provides before and after school care at both Birch Grove Primary School and Tolland Intermediate School for children in kindergarten through grade six. Families that have children at both schools may choose to have children attend the Birch Grove site. Children in 6th grade will be bussed over to Tolland Intermediate School.

Policies and Procedures

Registration is not complete until the TFRC-SAC receives the completed forms, registration fee and deposit.

It is <u>very important</u> for the TFRC staff to know when your child will be absent from the School-Age Care Program on a scheduled day. If you call or send a note to your child's teacher to report his/her absence or early dismissal from school, you must also notify the Family Resource Center by phone or email.

- * The hours of the Before School Program are 7:00 a.m. until 8:30 a.m.
- * The hours of the After School Program are from the end of the school day until 6:00 p.m. A late fee will be charged after 6:00 p.m.
- * All monthly invoices will be emailed prior to the first of the month, please notify us if your email address changes.
- * Tuition payments are due by the 1^{st} of the month. A late fee of \$20.00 will be charged if paid after the 5^{th} of the month.
- * Parents may register in the Parent Portal and have the option of paying online. Parents choosing to pay us directly should place the check in the fee payment box located at each site or mailed to the Family Resource Center, 247 Rhodes Road, Tolland. Please make payments payable to **Tolland Board of Education**.
- * The center will be open during in-service/conference days and mid-winter/spring breaks. Advance registration is required for non-school days. Registration will be accepted on a first come first serve basis. Additional fees will be charged for these days. We must have 15 children enrolled to open.
- * The program is closed for all public school holidays, the winter break in December, and any closings due to inclement weather.

- * Should your childcare needs change and you would like to add additional days you must complete a Change in Registration Form. (Found on the website) Approval will be based on enrollment. If you need to withdraw your child from the program or decrease the number of days your child attends a one-month notice must be given to the coordinator. Please complete the Change in Registration Form.
