Classroom Procedures

What to Expect in Class Each Day	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Daily warm up problem • Review of homework or instruction from previous day • Daily lesson • Practice problems/Homework time
Restroom	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • You should make every effort to use the bathroom during the 3 minutes of class change. • You will receive 3 bathroom passes during each 9 weeks. Use them wisely. You must ask before leaving. • Take the pass beside the door when you go. Return the pass. • Try your best to ask to go during independent work time, not while I am teaching.
Homework	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Homework will be given most days. • There will be many times that there will not be enough time for it to be completed in class and will need to be completed at home. This is for you to practice what we are learning! • Homework may be graded on completion and/or correctness depending on the assignment.
Entering the Classroom	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Enter quietly. • Go directly to your seat and sit down. • Have your binder, pencil, calculator, homework etc. • Begin your bell ringer in your composition notebook!
Absent	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • When you are absent you should check the folder hanging on the wall that corresponds with your class period. • Lessons and videos will be available in Schoology when the lesson/activity permits. If you are absent for an extended period of time, there will be a way for you to keep up! • Tests need to be arranged with the teacher to be made up during lab or an elective class. • Assignments will need to be made up within 3 days of the student returning. Refer to the student handbook for questions.
Late Work	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Work is considered late if it is not turned in at the time and period that it is due (unless you are absent). • 10 points will be deducted from any assignment if it is late, up to 1 day. You are responsible for turning it in late, I will not ask you for it. After 1 day, the assignment will not be accepted. • If you are absent when an assignment is due, it is expected to be turned in during the period you return.
Vocabulary Quizzes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Vocabulary words for a unit will be given out and added to Schoology at the beginning of a unit. • The day before the unit test, a vocabulary quiz will be given.
