#### **Introduction**

Welcome! This information guide is intended to support students and families who are new to East Granby High School. Additional information can be found on our school website, including our handbook and program of studies. We hope that you find this information helpful as you make your transition to our school.

#### Registration

New students must complete the necessary registration forms located on pages 12-19. Once the required registration paperwork is completed, new students and their families will have an individual appointment set with a high school counselor. The school counselor will review the student's previous courses, grades, and test scores, determine credit awarded for any students entering grades 10-12, and advise the student with an appropriate course of study for the coming school year.

Prior to meeting with the school counselor, new students and families are asked to review the program of studies, available for download on our high school website, to better understand the course sequencing, programming options available and graduation requirements.



#### **Academic Support**

EGHS provides multiple opportunities for students to receive academic support. Teachers are available for conferences and extra help before and after school each day. EGHS also offers tutoring services each period for students during their study halls. Students who desire extra help are urged to make the necessary arrangements with their teacher or tutor. A late bus is available once per week for students who stay after for academic support.

#### Student Assistance Team/Scientifically Research Based Intervention

The Scientifically Research Based Intervention (SRBI) Team identifies and assists students who are not performing to their potential. These teams are comprised of teachers, administrators and support professionals from the staff who meet on a regular basis to intervene and provide support for students who are at risk academically or behaviorally. Guidance, academic support, and mentoring are offered. Students can also be referred to programs and agencies outside the school when appropriate.

#### Library/Media Center

The library media center is located on the main floor and is an important area of the school. It incorporates all library functions, but is much more than a library. In addition to housing library books, the library/media center has a collection of films and videos and a bank of computers, iPads, Chromebooks and laptops for individual or class use. Furthermore, an instructional area with a mounted SMART Board is available, as well as a number of other resources including selected magazines and newspapers, both current and older copies for reference.

#### **Important Information**

#### **Attendance**

- A student is considered to be "in attendance" if present at school, or an assigned activity by the school, (e.g. field trip), for at least half of the regular school day.
- Any student who is not in attendance is therefore considered to be absent. It is the primary responsibility of the parent/guardian to notify the school when their child is absent.
- A "half day" at East Granby High School is defined as being in school at least 4 full periods.
- Tardiness to school is defined as arriving after the school bell at 7:40 A.M. and four unexcused tardies will be considered the equivalent of an unexcused absence.
- Any student who leaves the building without permission is not allowed to return to school for any reason that day or take part in any after school activities.
- Students that accumulate more than four unexcused absences in a month or ten in one year are considered truant (CT Gen Statutes 46b-149).
- Parents can excuse students for absences one through nine, but starting with the tenth absence, additional documentation is needed. In the absence of documentation, absences will be considered unexcused.

#### **Driving Privileges**

Approval may be given to students to drive to school. Students must register their vehicles in the school office and pay a registration fee. Students must also display an East Granby High School Parking Permit.

#### **Press Release**

Photographs may be taken of the students during school sponsored events, sporting events or by the staff in their classroom for use in our Newsletter or in local papers for publicity of their achievement. If you do not wish to have your child's image used outside of our school, you may fill out the *Media Recording Release Form* and return it to the office.

#### Lunches

East Granby is a "brown bag lunch" school district. The schools in-district do not provide hot lunch daily. Lunch periods are approximately twenty-four minutes long. On most days, there is a sponsoring group who sells lunch items and the school store has an array of snacks and beverages. However, because there is no way to account for the number of students purchasing food each day, these sales are an added benefit and not to be relied upon as the sole provider for lunch. Students should always bring their own lunch with them to school. Parents are requested not to bring lunch to students during the day because having to call into classrooms causes unnecessary disruptions. For sanitary reasons, consumption of food is not permitted in other areas of the school.

#### **Lockers**

Students will be assigned a locker on the first day of school. Students are not to share lockers and are expected to keep possessions only in the locker assigned to them. Lockers are expected to remain locked at all times. The school will not be responsible for lost or stolen items left out in the open or in an unlocked locker or shared locker. No student shall keep or store in a locker any item which is illegal or in violation of school regulations or which endangers the health, safety, or welfare of self or others. Lockers are school property and may be inspected by authorized school personnel.

#### **Transportation**

Transportation to and from school is an important extension of the total educational process. Appropriate bus conduct is essential in order to maintain the safety standards necessary to insure the health and welfare of all our students. \* The Student Council is an organized group of students who meet regularly and share in the life of the school. Student Council is involved in learning, service, leadership, citizenship, fun, self-growth, caring, human relations, and much more. Student Council engages students, clubs, teachers, parents, administrators, and community members in activities that benefit the entire school community.

Student Council provides opportunities for <u>all</u> students to get involved. Even if a student is not a representative, he/she may participate in dance committees, fundraising drives, making decisions, and many other activities. Student Council exists to serve the students and the school. Election for Student Council representatives is held in the fall semester.

#### **Athletics**

Eligibility status is determined by the principal based upon school rules and CIAC requirements. Students who represent East Granby High School are required to meet academic and conduct standards in order to become eligible and continue to participate in interscholastic athletic competition. Individual coaches may set further standards than those defined in the student handbook. These will be approved by the principal and athletic coordinator and handed out to the athletes involved. A uniform penalty, as stated under school rules, will be enforced. All students participating in athletics are subject to the Pay to Participate fees.

#### Pay to Play

#### Pay to Participate:

The following rules shall apply to the Student Activities Fee:

- The fee established by the Board of Education must be paid, or a waiver approved, before any high school student may begin participation in any of the activities covered by Board policy in which a fee has been imposed. The fee may be reviewed by the Board at the start of the second semester.
- The fee is non-refundable
- A student enrolling for the first time in the high school on or after the beginning of the second semester of the school year may be allowed to pay 50% of the Student Activities Fee. However, in no case will the fee be otherwise prorated or reduced unless approved for waiver as described in Board policy.
- Students who are approved for, or eligible to be approved for free or reduced price meals may seek a waiver to the payment of the fee by submitting a request to the Principal on BOE FORM 5139 (may be obtained in the office).
- Persons seeking, but denied, waiver of the fee may appeal the Principal's decision to the Superintendent of Schools within 10 school days of the Principal's decision. The Superintendent's decision will be final and there shall be no further right of appeal.
- The fee for this school year is: \$200.00 per student for the first sport/club and \$125.00 for the second with a family cap of \$325.00 for sport or club participation.

#### NOTIFICATION OF REQUIREMENTS OF THE "NO CHILD LEFT BEHIND ACT"

The East Granby Public School System is pleased to offer students a computer network designed to provide access to instructional software, electronic mail, and the Internet. These opportunities are being provided to enhance the delivery of the educational program. To gain independent access to e-mail and the Internet, all students must acknowledge and agree that they have read and understand the rules and guidelines for acceptable use of the computers. Should a parent prefer that a student not have Internet access, a signed statement from the parent or guardian should be sent to the high school. The student will have use of the computers for word processing, access to instructional software packages, and for teacher-supervised projects using the Internet.

The purpose of providing Internet and other computer network access in this district is to promote the exchange of information and ideas with the global community. All network use must be consistent with the policies and goals of this school district. Inappropriate use of district technology will result in the loss of technology use, disciplinary action, and/or referral to legal authorities.

#### **Students & Parents**

I have read this Technology and Internet User Agreement and I understand that access is for educational purposes only. The East Granby Public School District (the "District") has taken precautions to eliminate controversial material. However, I also recognize it is impossible for the District to restrict access to all controversial and inappropriate materials. I will hold harmless the District, its employees, agents, or EGBOE members, for any harm caused by materials or software obtained via any and all electronic sources. I accept that it is the full responsibility of the parent/guardian to supervise student use of electronic devices and networks when not in the school setting.

I understand the District and/or its agents may access and monitor my use of any electronic devices, District-assigned services, and District internet usage, including email, files, and downloaded material, without prior notice to me.
