Non High-Risk Settings Guidance for Suspected or Confirmed COVID-19 Cases

Scenario	Immediate Action	Follow Up
<p>COVID-19 Symptoms</p> <p>(e.g., fever, dry cough, sore throat, diarrhea, runny nose, headache, loss of taste or smell, difficulty breathing)</p>	<p>Send home and recommend contact with primary care provider for recommendations regarding need for testing.</p> <p>If negative COVID-19 test result (PCR) or (antigen- consider retesting if using antigen 24 hours after negative test) or COVID-19 is ruled out by primary care provider (something else other than COVID-19 infection is reason for symptoms), can return 24 hours after fever resolves and symptoms have improved.</p> <p>For Symptom Screening see CDPH COVID19 Symptoms and CCHS COVID Symptoms Chart below.</p> <p>Get tested even if you are fully vaccinated.</p> <p>Testing is readily available through CCHS, State or Commercial Testing Sites.</p> <p>Take steps to prevent the spread</p>	<p>No notification of Contra Costa Health Services (CCHS) required.</p> <p>Notification of workplace/school/Childcare in this scenario is at the discretion of each entity and not required by CCHS.</p>
<p>COVID-19 Positive Test Result requires isolation</p> <p>Individuals with or without symptoms and have had a COVID Antigen or Molecular (PCR tests, viral RNA tests, nucleic acid tests) test.</p>	<p>Must isolate to prevent the spread of COVID; stay home for at least 5 days from when you tested positive for COVID-19:</p> <p><u>You will no longer need to isolate after day 5 if:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Symptoms are not present, or are mild and improving; AND • You are fever-free for 24 hours (without the use of fever-reducing medication). <p>If you have a fever, isolation should be continued until 24 hours after fever resolves</p>	<p><u>Notify CCHS Using the Intake Form If:</u></p> <p>Schools/Daycares:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Elementary Schools and Childcare: report clusters of 3 or more cases in the same classroom including teachers and students. - Middle and High Schools: report if 10% of campus population are COVID 19 positive in a 14-day period. <p>Non High-Risk businesses:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - No reporting required. Recommended to reach out when needing guidance or when absenteeism is high, 10% is the

	<p>without the use of fever-reducing medications.</p> <p>If you can end your isolation after day 5 wear a well-fitted mask around others for a total of 10 days, especially in indoor settings, and continue to follow other preventive measures and masking guidance.</p> <p>Next Steps</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Identify Close Contacts. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Recommend testing of contacts, prioritize symptomatic contacts. - Close contacts <i>may</i> need quarantine. (ex. If they are symptomatic) 	<p>suggested threshold for checking in with CCHS.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Proceed with isolation of case and notification of close contacts. 2. If reported CCHS will follow up confirming receipt of the report and provide a contact for any questions. <p>Employee notification requirements: CalOSHA COVID-19 Non-Emergency Regulations CalOSHA COVID-19 Non-Emergency Standards FAQ</p>
<p>Contact to COVID-19 Positive</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Quarantine not required. 2. Get tested between days 3-5 after being exposed to someone with COVID-19. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❖ If the test is positive, follow isolation instructions. 3. Wear a well-fitting mask around others for 10 days, especially indoors. 4. If you develop symptoms, get tested right away and stay home (isolation). <p>Continue to use preventive measures such as the use of a mask/face covering, social distancing from others and proper handwashing.</p> <p>Work restrictions after a close contact should be reviewed with your workplace.</p>	<p>No notification of CCHS require</p> <p>Per CalOSHA: Employers are required to Notify all employees and their authorized representatives who may have had close contact with a COVID-19 case within one business day in a manner that does not reveal the COVID-19 case's personal identifying information.</p>












