

College Trends

- > Increased competition
- > Earlier deadlines
- Self-reported grades no recs or official transcripts needed (for some schools)
- > Fewer recommendations
- > Increased use of Waitlist and "creative" acceptances
- > Increased number of Test Optional Schools
- > Increased popularity in-state and public schools
- > Alternative ways to express interest



Getting Started



- > Letters of Recommendation requested (In person & on Naviance)
- Resume sent to recommender and counselor
- Begin online applications double check all deadlines!
- Write essay(s)
- > Take SAT/ACT and/or send scores (allow at least three weeks for processing)
- > Transcript Request Form submitted to School Counselor three weeks prior to the application deadline





The Common Application

- Online Application (900+ Colleges)
- > Takes about an hour to complete the basic application Info Use student's personal email address (not simsburyschools.net email address)
- > Personal Essay
- > Supplemental Questions for some schools
- > Application Fees
- > Teacher Reports and School Reports <u>all</u> sent through Naviance
- Print and check for accuracy before sending appsupport@commonapp.net –help with issues/questions.

- □ **Official Score Reports** need to be sent directly from College Board
- ☐ Allow **at least 3 weeks** for scores to arrive at your colleges
- ☐ The registration fee covers 4 score reports if ordered at time when you register or up to 9 days after test date
- ☐ After that it costs \$12/college
- Super-Scoring



Financial Aid

- College
- FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid opens October 1, 2022) application for the 2023/24 School Year
 Use tax return submitted in Jan-April 2022/based on 2021 income
- > CSS Profile (for specific colleges Available in October 2022)
- ➤ College **Financial Aid Application** (if applicable)
- > Scholarships

Local Scholarships (application available in January)

Other Scholarships (scholarship websites, employment, religious affiliations, etc.)

- > Use Net Price Calculators (available on college websites)
- > "How to Pay for College" Program
