

Camus Fun Fact: Camus struggled with tuberculosis throughout his entire life, often retiring to the mountains, a folk remedy for tuberculosis.




Camus Fun Fact: Albert Camus tried to enlist during WWII several times, unsuccessfully, and felt humiliated by the fact that he was too ill to enlist.


