
We can't wait to see you in 2nd grade!!

What should I expect in 2nd Grade?

Students should be able to:

- Read on grade level books (beginning w/ level J)for about 20 minutes
 - * Use a variety of strategies to read difficult words
 - Use a variety of strategies to comprehend what they've read
- * Choose just right books
 - Answer questions in complete sentences





- Basic math facts—Addition and Subtraction
 - •Skip count to 100 by 2's, 5's, and 10's
- Money Be able to identify coins and give the value of each
 - Place Value Identify ones, tens, and hundreds place
- •Time Be able to identify the hour and minute hand. Be able to tell time to the hour
 - •Solve single and multi-step word problems

This year students will need to MASTER basic math facts (addition, subtraction, and multiplication 0,1,2,5,10's)



- Correct letter formation (HANDWRITING!)
- Write a complete sentence with proper capitalization, punctuation, and spacing
- Write correctly on wide
 ruled notebook paper such
 as how to write on the lines and
 recognize that the holes are on
 the left side of the paper
