



The constellation Náhookos bik'ii, Ursa Major is commonly known as the Big Dipper. Náhookos bik'ii is a model of fathers, grandfathers, and uncles of the human race. Náhookos bik'ii stays in the northern night sky, and like a clock hand revolves in a counter clockwise direction.

Náhookos Bikó' *Polaris (Ursa Minor)*

The constellation Náhookos bikó', North star, is a portrait of fire and is located between the constellations Náhookos bik'ii, Ursa Major and Náhookos bi'adíi, Cassiopeia. Náhookos bikó' represents the central fire in all homes.


Náhookos Bi'adíi *Cassiopeia*


Náhookos bi'adíi, Cassiopeia is a female constellation. She is a model for all mothers, maternal and paternal grandmothers, and great grandmothers. Náhookos bi'adíi remains and revolves in the northern night sky. It is like a clock hand revolving in a counter clockwise direction.






Ursa major-Big dipper



