Through these hands-on activities students will learn about the importance of Texas symbols, especially the Lone Star, to our community.

The Tour Features the following activities...

Lone Star Round Up: A treasure hunt to find lost Lone Stars and learn about Texas ranching and patriotic symbols.

Computer Kiosks: Interactive stations that feature Texas symbols and a memory matching game.

Beyond the Dome: A twelve minute video about secret spaces of the Capitol.
