- In 1926, Carter G. Woodson "Father of Black History", sponsored a national "Negro History Week"
 - Recognized the achievements of Black Americans and others of African descent
- In the 1960's, college campuses expanded "Negro History Week" to Black History Month
- In 1976, Black History Month was officially recognized in the United States by President Gerald Ford
 - He wanted citizens to "seize the opportunity to honor the too-often neglected accomplishments of Black Americans in every area of endeavor throughout our history
- 2023 Theme: Black Resistance
 - explores how African Americans have resisted historic and ongoing oppression, in all forms, especially the racial terrorism of lynching, racial pogroms and police killings, since the nation's earliest days.
