Effective Assessment and Progress Monitoring

Student data provides feedback about what students are learning and what they still need to learn. Data collected informally on a daily basis and formally at the end of units and specific milestones throughout the year help to guide learning and teaching. This data includes:

- Virginia Standards of Learning (SOL) Assessments
- Daily teacher observation and formative assessment
- Daily student work products
- End-of-unit assessments
- Normed screening instruments, including the Math Diagnostic Assessment (MDA)
- Reading assessments such as running records, Reading Inventories (RI), and Phonological Awareness Literacy Screening (PALS)
- Common assessments in English Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies
- Transfer tasks and other forms of performance assessment and projects that emphasize student transfer of learning to real-life settings and problems
