Elephant Toothpaste

Fifth grade science teachers Mrs. Grabowski and Mr. Zangerl conducted a fun demonstration for all fifth graders during lunches. The demonstration, called "Elephant Toothpaste" was part of a science unit on chemical reactions. During the demonstration, the teachers combined hydrogen peroxide, dish soap, warm water and yeast. The chemical reaction that took place resulted in a foamy.



Slime in Mrs. Williams Class

Students in Mrs. Williams class participated in a science lab conducted by Mr. Ruede, Science Supervisor. The lab included an experiment called The Case of the Odd Motions. The lab enabled students to make magnetic slime out of corn starch, glue and iron oxide.

1:1 District Chromebook Initiative

An email will be sent to third grade families on January 22. The only costs associated with the devices are an optional insurance policy and an optional hardshell protective case.



More Reading Ideas from the T.I.S. Reading Department

Why you should explore graphic novels ...





The combination of pictures and text inspires a love of reading and books.

The balance of text and pictures eases kids into building stamina for sustained reading. This also allows kids who have been turned off to books to finish a whole book!

Graphic novels help to build comprehension and critical thinking skills.

The pictures combined with more advanced vocabulary allow young readers to immediately find out what's happening in the book and graphic novels have more complex storylines than picture books.

The art helps to tell the story and build inference.

Engaging artwork creates a bridge to inference for characters' emotions (they can read the facial expressions) and drawings take the place of long descriptive passages keeping young readers engaged longer.

Graphic novels can provide a great family bonding opportunity.

You and your child can assume the role of a character and take turns reading the parts and discussing the meaning being conveyed in the pictures. Talk about a good time!

Graphic novels inspire creativity and writing.

The fast pace and plot centered action keep the attention of energetic young readers and inspire them to try writing and drawing their own graphic novels.

In the month of February, the third grade cohort made up of **Babiec, Arner,**Cyr and Fischer will have Art starting Feb, 22 2021. During this three week cohort the students will need to bring their art material to class every day. Students should have scissors, a glue stick, a ruler, an eraser, a pencil and a set of markers. We will be working on the following projects during this cohort: Paper Quilting, Clay Containers, Virtual Wednesday Drawings and a Tempera Painting project.

Remote learners will need to pick up their art materials at the T.I.S. office before the cohort begins. Remote learners will need to let the teacher know their color choice of glazes and paint they wish to be sent home. If parents do not want their child doing clay at home please let me know as soon as possible so other plans can be made. See you soon!

Mrs. Hill - Library Media

During the month of February, the third grade cohort groups of Arner, Babiec, Cyr and Fischer will have Library as their Unified Arts special until February 12th; and the third grade cohort groups of Koss, LeBlanc and Williams will start Library February 22nd. All third grade students will be practicing skills they learned in Library back in September such as library arrangement, Destiny searching and basic technology applications. In addition, they will show competency in opening, editing and turning in assignments for Google docs, slides and forms. Students will also complete a short, wild animal research project, write some poetry and participate in some STEM challenges.

<u>Grade 3 general music:</u> The third grade students in Mrs. Koss's, Mrs. William's, and Mr. LeBlanc's classes are working hard on learning to read eighth notes, sixteenth notes and syncopated rhythms. They are learning folk songs, folk dances and fables related to colonial Tolland. Third graders are experiencing music through movement, playing non-pitched percussion and using boomwhackers.

There will be no grade 3 concert.

<u>Grade 4 general music:</u> Starting in **April** the fourth graders will be learning about the music and geography of Africa, Asia and Europe. They will be playing games, instruments, dancing and singing songs from those continents and cultures.

Grade 5 general music: It's Ukulele Time!!!! Starting in February the fifth graders are very excited to start learning the ukuleles. They will learn to read chord charts and tabs. The ukulele unit will be integrated with the music, instruments and culture of Hawaii.

Grade 5 Chorus: We will be doing in person chorus on Thursday mornings at 8:30 in room 136. Remote students are asked to join via google classroom. The grade 5 chorus members have been asking to meet earlier in the morning in order to have more time working on music. I will send out an email if we extend our chorus time. Thank you, Ms. Baker

Grade 4 Band: Wind instrument classes began during the week of February 1st! Students have attended their first Band class and are very excited to be in Band. We are in the process of learning how to safely assemble and disassemble our instruments and to produce a first sound on the instrument. Most of the Percussionists had a head start and they are able to play several melodies on the bells and perform snare drum rhythms with a steady beat!

Being part of the band means that each week, students have SMALL GROUP instruction time whether you are an in-person learner or a remote learner. This year, we are using a rotating pull-out schedule during the school day. 4th grade Band Students will have their Band class on a fixed day of the week (either Tuesday or Friday) but the time of the class will change weekly. We are using special music masks and bell covers on our instruments when we play in school just like Band members in TMS and THS. Band is a graded class. 60 minutes per week of Home Practice is recommended for success and is an important commitment for students to make.

Grade 5 Band: The 5th Grade Band small group classes have been meeting in person in Mrs. Marchesani's room and remote from home students are included in the schedule. We are using a rotating pull out schedule so Band students do not miss the same class every week. We are using special music masks and bell covers on our instruments when we play in school just like Band members in TMS and THS. Students are mastering the "Concert Eb Scale Preps for Beginning Band" by Mike Hannickel. "Regal March" is sounding very good and students are more

comfortable with 1st and 2nd endings. At the end of February, we will start learning "Montego Bay".


