FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S OFFICE:

Adherence to In-Person or Remote Designation

All students are assigned to one of two designations, either in-person M, T, Th and F or fully remote. Please understand that these designations must not be changed simply for the sake of convenience. Sudden changes to a child's designation often results in a student not having the necessary materials needed to participate in classroom lessons. Keeping a child at home because they are not feeling well and having them work remotely is an appropriate reason to switch a designation in the short term, abruptly switching a child to remote as a matter of convenience cannot be accommodated.

Bookfair

A modified version of our annual Spring book fair will be held the week of March 22-26. The modified version of the fair will consist of Scholastic bookcases being placed in an open area of the building. Students will be walked to the fair in small groups. Prior to and after visiting the fair, student groups will be required to wash or sanitize their hands. Students wishing to order a book from the fair will be provided with an order form. Order forms may be returned to a child's classroom teacher the following day. Book orders will be processed in the evenings and left in classrooms for students to take home.

Celebration in Mrs. Babiec's Class

On Friday, February 12, students in Mrs. Babiec's class learned about Chinese New Year. As a culminating activity, the class held a mini-parade throughout the school. (See pics on next page.)





2:45 Dismissal Beginning March 29

Both T.I.S. and Birch Grove will begin dismissing students at 2:45 on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays beginning March 30. After school pickups will be held from 2:45 - 3:10 in the rear of the building. On Wednesdays, students will be dismissed at 12:45. After school pickups will be held from 12:45 - 1:10 in the rear of the building.

Chromebooks

Students will need to bring district issued Chromebooks back and forth to school each day. The reasoning behind this decision is that teachers may be assigning tasks that require the use of a district issued device from home. Personally owned devices may soon become obsolete for district use, as the IT department will not be able to continually push out apps and updates to devices that are not part of the district domain. In addition, at this point the schools do not have mass charging capabilities for devices.

SBAC Testing

Tolland Intermediate School will be administering the SBAC test to students the week of April 25. Students will be taking the test on their newly issued Chromebooks. More information regarding the SBAC will be sent out later this month.

Fifth Grade Esteem Day

On Monday, April 5th, T.I.S. fifth grade students will have the unique opportunity to spend the morning with a group of Esteem trained students from Canton High School. These high school students are trained counselors who work with younger children as part of a program known as Esteem.

Some of the topics covered in the Esteem program are:

Self-esteem

Awareness of drug and alcohol-related issues

Empathy

Peer pressure

Developing coping skills

The Canton High students and advisers will work remotely along with our students and teachers discussing topics listed above. Thanks to the Esteem coordinators from Canton High School, Mrs. Racco and Miss Yaglowski for adapting the traditional Esteem Program in order for our students to experience it this year amidst COVID-19 restrictions.

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN OUR CLASSROOMS

GRADE 3

First, we would like to reach out and thank you for all of your support during the changes this year. We have made it through hybrid, transitioning to 4 day in person, then we went remote for a brief time, and now we are moving towards 5 day in-person. These are a lot of changes and everyone is doing a wonderful job with all the transitions. Especially the students! They are such troopers and are doing just what they should be doing. Wearing a mask, remaining socially distant, washing hands, and following new school protocols are not easy and our TIS Hawks are doing amazing. Thank you for all your support at home!

In addition to all of these new routines, they are plugging right along in our third-grade curriculum. In Fundations most classes are working on Unit 8, which focuses on the -le syllable type, adding suffixes, and many sound alike words. In our Journeys Reading Program students are reading non-fiction texts about finding fossils, trees, and then we will read a play called Two Bear Cubs. We are focusing on text features, story structure and making inferences. Our grammar focuses are the verb "Be" and comparing nouns. Please continue to read each night with your child, you can read together, or they can read independently.

Our third-grade teachers have been teaching about multiplication, fractions, rounding, and many other skills in our various math programs. The best way to support learning is to have students practice their math facts at home. You can have them work on Reflex or play math games such as reject, war, circles and stars, and any other fun activity that reinforces math facts. Flash cards or just practicing in the car on the way to sports, events or even Big Y can make a big difference.

In science we are working on a unit called "Odd Motion". We are learning about forces, gravity, magnetism, and other skills in physics. Students have done experiments involving moving matchbox cars, and some classes have even made magnetic slime. Third graders are very excited about these hands-on activities. We'll be moving on to a unit on fossils and then transitioning back to social studies this spring.

Again, thank you for all that you are doing at home to support inperson learners and remote learners. We are excited about the change to 5 day in-person learning at the end of March. We just can't wait to have students in for a full- week.

GRADE 4

Fourth grade students are working with decimals and fractions. We are engaging in various activities to help students visualize these concepts. During math learning lab students are expanding their math skills in other areas, such as graphs, charts, and measurement, and also reinforcing skills that have already been covered..

In Language Arts, we started Unit 3, "Inside Nature", which focuses on non-fiction selections about understanding what's happening in the natural world around us. This unit aligns nicely with the social studies unit about the Northeast Region of the country, and also the next science unit about biomimicry. Non-fiction writing skills, such as research, planning, and drafting an expository piece of writing, are being integrated with the social studies and science units to provide students with practical application of their writing skills.

Our students continue to enthusiastically embrace learning though the uncertain environment of a pandemic. We are so proud of them.

GRADE 5

Fifth graders have been challenged to collectively read 150 books for the month of March. Students have read almost 50 books already! Please encourage your child to read at home.

Fifth grade scientists are wrapping up their Astronomy unit and will soon begin their Biology unit. This unit focuses on abiotic and biotic factors that help ecosystems to thrive. The main organism students are focused on are the Golden Jellyfish of Lake Palau.

In math, students are beginning their new unit which focuses first on multiplication of decimals by whole numbers, and then division of decimals by whole numbers. These computations are investigated using concrete models, calculators, and drawings, and arise from a variety of problem situations. The unit emphasizes estimation and understanding of place value in order to determine placement of the decimal point. A special focus is multiplication and division by powers of 10.

In ELA, students finished reading "The Phantom Tollbooth," by Norton Juster last week. This entertaining book used literal and figurative language for a play on words. To culminate the unit, students enjoyed watching the movie with the entire grade logged into one google classroom.

To reinforce figurative language, students are reading "Loser," by Jerry Spinelli. Students are working in small groups reading, discussing and answering comprehension questions with their book clubs.

Social Studies students just finished their performance assessment presentations for Colonization and are starting Unit 3: The French and Indian War and American Revolution.

Fifth grade teachers are excited to have a virtual Esteem Program this year. The program will take place in the classrooms on Monday, April 8th 9:00 am to 10:50 am with class activities to follow. There will also be a recorded evening portion for parents to watch with your fifth grader at your convenience. More information is in the next few pages of this digital backpack.


